Bireley's Bottle Opener Cap Catcher Combo

Back in November of last year, eBay had one of the nicest bottle opener cap catcher combinations I've ever seen listed for sale. The Bireley's cap catcher (at right) was in beautiful shape and showed it had been well cared for during it's lifetime. The cap catcher stood about 16" high and had the number E-339-47 marked on the side of it. It can be assumed the 47 part of the

number stood for the date of manufacture 1947. It ended up fetching a lofty sum of \$898. It should be mentioned that the origi-

nal opener for it was missing and had been replace with a nice but incorrect Franz Krag bottle opener. The correct style bottle opener for it is pictured at left. It was able to accept the larger

Dacro crown caps which is shown on the cap catcher bottle.

Certain soda makers offered bottles with the Dacro caps between the late 1930's to the mid 1950's before switching to smaller standard size crown caps we're familiar with today. Bottles using these larger caps came in two basic sizes back then, 6.25 and 8 FL. OZ.
