Carl Conrad & Co. "The Original Bottlers of Budweiser"
--

Lehr Roe had a really unusual combination corkscrew wire breaker knife (a P-71-UL) at the convention. The knife read as follows, BUDWEISER / MOSS ROSE (STANHOPE WITH FACTORY SCENE "C.CONRAD & CO. 411 TO 419 NORTH SIXTH STREET ADOPTED CC&CO 1876 TRADE MARK ORIGINAL BUDWEISER REGISTERED CC&CO 1877 TRADE MARK"). He placed it in the auction and it did not reach his reserve. Apparently members were concerned if the knife was a true Budweiser piece. The knife is pictured below.



After the convention I called Lehr and decided to purchase the knife. I knew Don Bull had listed the original P-71. After telling Don the knife had a stanhope he became interested. The P-71 Don listed did not have a stanhope and read as follows, BUDWEISER / C.C. & CO. MOSS ROSE. I ended up trading the knife to Don for some types off of his trade list. I was curious about the origins of C. Conrad & Co. so I wrote the historical department of the Anheuser-Busch Companies. I received the following response from Mary Louise Brown, Curator of Collections/Assistant Archivist.

Your letter of June 28 was referred to the Archives for reply.

We have very little substantive information regarding Carl Conrad and his business. We do know that Conrad was born in Mainz, Germany in 1842, immigrated to St. Louis in 1861, and died in 1922.

Carl Conrad was a successful restaurateur and distributor of wines and beers who operated businesses in both St. Louis and Mainz, Germany.

In 1875 he and Adolphus Busch collaborated to develop a new brand of beer that would be acceptable to all tastes and capable of being shipped great distances without loss of quality. The beer they developed was BUDWEISER.

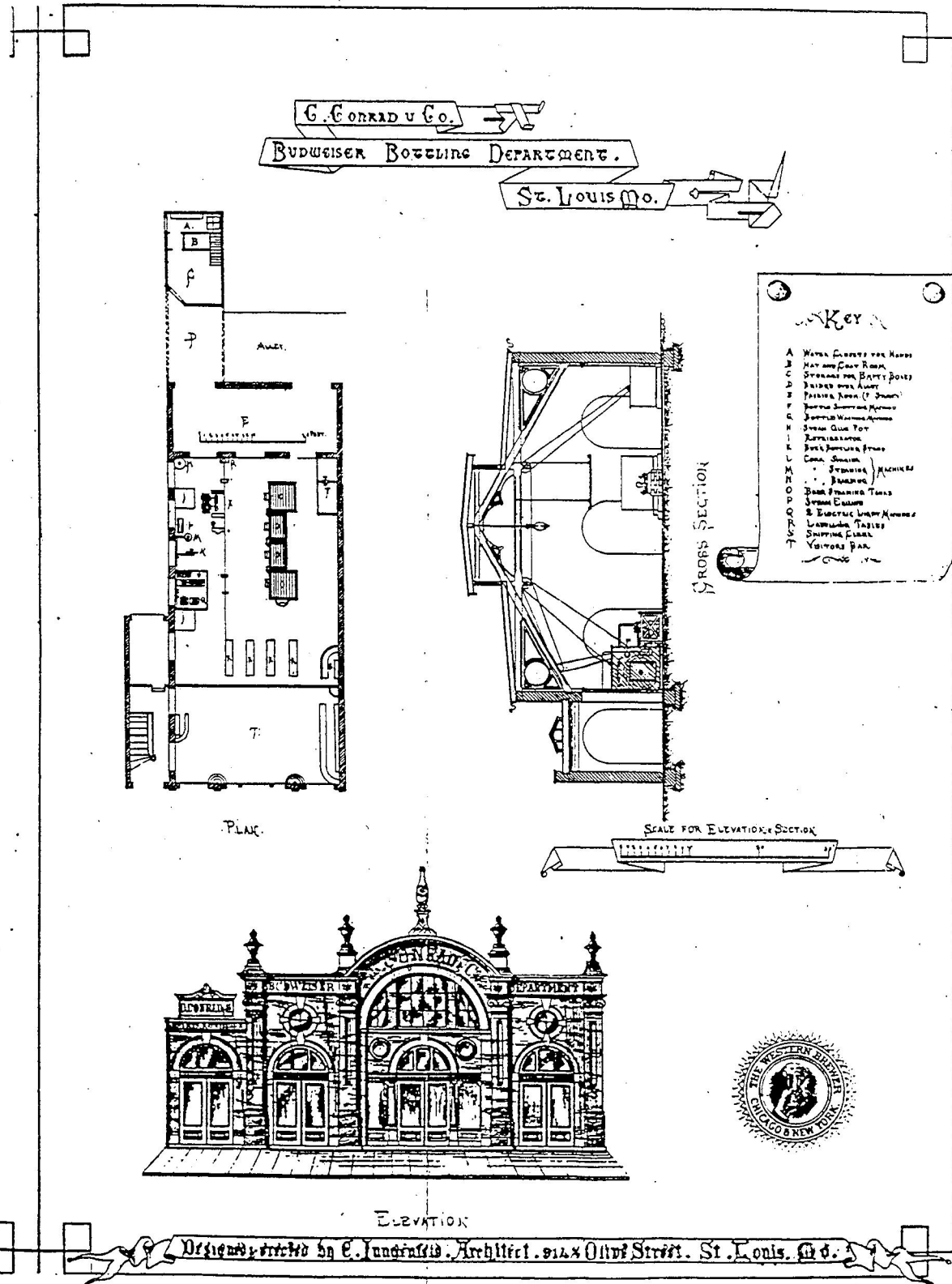

From 1876 to 1883 Conrad was the bottler and sole distributor of BUDWEISER, operating out of a modern facility at 6th and Locust Streets in downtown St. Louis. In 1883 having suffered financial losses in other enterprises, he sold his interest in BUDWEISER to Adolphus Busch and went to work for Anheuser-Busch as a special salesman and troubleshooter. He continued to work for the brewery until his death in 1922.

I would say this is conclusive evidence that the P-71 was an original Budweiser piece. Apparently "MOSS ROSE" was some type of wine distributed by Mr. Conrad. Mary Brown also enclosed an 1879 opera advertisement from San Francisco and from the Western Brewer magazine an architect's drawing of the C. Conrad & Co. bottling department. The building drawing looks very similar to the picture in the stanhope of the knife. If anyone has any more information on Carl Conrad please let me know.

Origin of the K-5 Barmount

Larry Biehl had to give up a K-5 for the following story and thank you for doing so.

May 17, 1996

To Whom It May Concern:

My name is Jeannine Wadoz Goggin, daughter of Andrew Peter Wadoz, inventor of the Andy's Speedy Beer Can Opener. You may want to know the story behind my dad's invention.

In 1947 our family moved from Chicago, Illinois, to Milwaukee, Wisconsin. A relative of my mother, Ethel Frances O'Hara Wadoz, operated the food stands and food service in the grand stand at the State Fair Park in West Allis. While the fair grounds was open all summer, the work intensified for the state fair in August, for the races, for the Packer football games. To satisfy the customer's needs, the beer had to be cold and served quickly! That need is what prompted my dad to invent his speedy beer can opener. Its unique feature was that it punched two holes in a beer can simultaneously. Now you know the "why" of his invention, you should also know the "how" of his invention.

We settled in a duplex at 3219 W. Oklahoma Avenue in Milwaukee. My dad worked at G.E. X-ray in the day and manufactured the beer can openers in our basement at night. My sister, Beverly, myself and my mom all had production responsibilities. I never got beyond dipping the rubber "buttons" into glue and placing them in holes at the base of the unit. Bev got to tap on the "Schlitz" logo -- many of our openers were distributed through the Joseph Schlitz Brewing Co. in Milwaukee. Mom did the bookkeeping. Daddy ground and polished the blades, assembled and shipped the units.

Often he rose early and worked in the basement. Daddy was a great bowler -- two or three nights a week he bowled in various leagues. Often he worked on the beer can openers before or after his bowling. It truly was a labor of love. To place this in perspective, my dad immigrated from Hungary in the early 1900s, only finished elementary school, did some technical school training, but he had vision and imagination for invention. He also invented a jar for dispensing mustard, a bun slicer which sliced all shapes and sizes of rolls and a blade/holder for cutting open cardboard cartons. I still see this final item used in today's grocery stores.

Daddy never patented any of these items. I don't think he wanted to put our family's financial resources into lawyer fees. But, money was never his objective. He simply enjoyed the work and productivity. By the way, the money earned sent mom to Las Vegas with her lady friends for an annual outing, sent myself and my sister to college, and gave our family security. If my memory is correct, Daddy was earning about \$12,000 at GE when we moved to Milwaukee. At its peak, daddy's beer can opener business grossed about \$25,000 year.

One last story -- my dad always claimed that he and some other friends invented the malted milk machine. They worked together at what was then Victor X-ray in Chicago. One of the men decided to take the invention to Horlich -- did so, and the patent became theirs. The remaining two men (my dad and another) never realized anything from the invention.

Saturday nite we had a great buffet, open bar, free raffle and several guest speakers. Afterwards at the Hospitality Room our good-byes were said to our fellow J.F.O. members, who by the way were so numerous they made for tough competition for those good openers. Our attending J.F.O. members included Don & Cora Whelan, Larry & Fran Biehl (Larry was elected again to a term as a director of the A.B.A.), Dick Creuzinger, Tom & Norma Fuerst, Art Santen (Mr. Plastic) and Don Sherman.

Sunday morning Shirley and I left for a 10 day sight seeing trip West thru Texas, New Mexico and Colorado. I didn't find too much breweriana out West. I think the Colorado collectors keep that area "picked" clean. However I did find an O-5 (oblong) ICY-O, O-6 Waupon, Wis. soda, A-13 London Dry Ginger Ale, a 7 1/2 inch heavy cast Russian Red Star Beer opener and two unknown to me Coca-Cola openers.

Shirley and I now have to wait until Oct 9th for the Midwest Breweriana Convention in Council Bluff, Iowa. Sure hope the gambling boat has some 5c slot machines for Shirley. Hope to see you there!

They were excellent and I had my allotted two and half of one of Eileen's. Besides the Jays and Johnsons other JFO members attending were Harold and Boots Queen, Art and Dorothy Santen, Dave Gausepohl, Herb and Helen Haydock and Roger and Chris Levesque. I am sure Art would have bought it if it was plastic. A pizza buffet was served that evening and I would have to wait until Thursday evening to see very many good openers. I did have an interesting conversation with Tom Ball. He is an avid collector of M-3 slide-outs and has 72 different beer and non-beer counting color variations (he volunteered to help with a total list of slide-outs). Once again by eleven I turned in.

Thursday was tour day. I had signed up for the historic brewery tour of Boston. We left the hotel at 10:00 and went to South Boston first. The first stop was the Boston Beer Company started in 1828. Only the building remained and after a short stop we went to the old Frank Jones Brewery. It seemed like an old large empty building but we found out it had 80 some artist tenants. The next stop was a tour of the Harpoon Micro Brewery. They had been in business since 1986 and were doing quite well in New England. We had lunch near Fenway Park (Boston Beer Works) and I did make a lap around Fenway Park with Art and Dorothy. The afternoon tour consisted of seeing the remnants of 14 old breweries in the Roxbury section of Boston. Several stops were made for pictures and unfortunately no openers turned up. The most exciting aspect of the tour was seeing the bus driver navigate the narrow streets in Boston and he saved his best for last when he backed through and around the old Haffenreffer Brewery Complex (now being used by Samuel Adams). We arrived back at the motel at 5:15.

Art and Eileen Johnson had been gracious enough to invite me to dinner at their house. Art picked me up at the motel and it was to an hour's drive to their home in Mendon, Mass. Eileen loves to cook and she had a great meal waiting that included fresh veggies and some more lobster. To top it off she had made a homemade blueberry pie. Pat was really jealous when I told her about the pie (her grandmother made b-pie in a wood stove in Canada).

Afterwards Art showed some of his opener collection the heart of which is an outstanding M-3 and M-73 slide-out collecting. He collects both beer and non-beer ones. Besides the openers he and Eileen collect a lot of everything. After a little trading Art took me back to the hotel. It was 11:00 when I got back and I decided to make a lap around and check the open rooms. Tom Atkinson another JFO member came into a room I was in and we started talking about corkscrews. We made it to his room and I ended up buying a M-3 F & S, an A-4 Elk Run and an A-21 Wehle. It was 1:00 when I went to bed.

1996 ECBA Convention Boston (Andover), Mass July 9th-July 13th (Continued)

Friday was ECBA officers meeting day. Next year's convention is in Lancaster, PA. and tentatively set for Cleveland, OH in 1998. I bought a few openers that afternoon but nothing too exciting the best being a M-3 Zetts in excellent condition. The ECBA display room ran by Ken Ostrow was open Friday and I brought some New England openers to show. Friday was the banquet and each attendee was given a new style Harpoon beer opener (see new discoveries). Friday night was pretty slow and by 11:00 I was in bed.

Saturday was the ECBA breakfast meeting followed by breweriana show open to the public. The breakfast lasted until 10:00 and then it was time to set up for the show. I helped Art and Eileen carry in their merchandise. The "bottle man", Gary Deachman, showed up and I hadn't seen him since the JFO Reading convention in 1994. He was doing pretty good and had driven two hours from New Hampshire to the show. Right after the show started I bought my only opener that day at the show, an A-1-6 Fink in G-VG condition. The price wasn't cheap, \$25, but it was a variation I didn't have. Gary had brought a nice selection of openers for sale and trade. I ended up spending a little over \$200 for some beer and soda "A"s and "B"s. We also traded four openers style for style except I had an A-14-1 in rough shape and took an A-15 Schwab in nice condition for it. Gary bought a couple of openers from Ken Ostrow and we spent the rest of the show till 3:00 talking about old times. By 2:00 the show was pretty much over (it seems all breweriana/opener shows fizzle out right after lunch).

Norm and Judy headed down to Cape Cod for another week's vacation and Art and Dorothy also headed down to the Cape for a few days. After helping Art Johnson load up he was kind enough to take me to the airport. Hurricane "Bertha" had brought heavy rains all day long and my flight was delayed 30 minutes. I arrived back in Durham at 7:30 happy to see Pat and Corkie and having made it home with 75 new openers. Another good convention and I was getting excited about NABA even though it was 2 and 1/2 weeks away.

1996 NABA Convention Waukesha, WI July 31st to August 4th

Wednesday morning Pat had me at the airport by 6:30. I left Raleigh-Durham at 7:15 EST and arrived in Chicago at 8:00 CST. From there I caught "the puddle jumper" to Milwaukee. The flight lasted 25 minutes and when I arrived at Billy Mitchell Airport Norm and Judy Jay were waiting to pick me up. The Country Inn Hotel was 20 miles away and it was 10:30 when we arrived. The convention had a good start when Norm and I were both able to check in at that time.

Several rooms were open and I my first purchase was a A-53 Coca-Cola in VG condition for \$50. Not cheap but I really like the ladies' ballet legs openers. After helping Norm unload his car I followed him into Harold Mann's room. Harold is one of the leading breweriana dealers in the country and usually has several good openers for sale but this time he only had a P-1 A-B in EX condition for \$85 and a P-8-UL Iowa Co. corkscrew for \$45. I passed on those two items but he did have a glass mug with a porcelain top advertising "Oelsner's Pilsner The Stanley Buffet and Cafe". Norm was not interested even though mugs are his first love because he was not sure if it was American so I bought the mug since it had my name on it. It was my first "Stanley" breweriana piece. Later on I found a mint A-42-16 (fish) Port Washington in mint condition for \$25.

1996 NABA Convention Waukesha, WI July 31st to August 4th (Continued)

After lunch Jeff Vick (a Minnesota collector) had a nice P-76-1 Schlitz for \$100. The piece was made by Robert Murphy of Boston. The afternoon yielded a lot of soda openers and a few miscellaneous beer openers. Most of the soda openers came from Phil Mandzuk, a Canadian member of JFO. Phil was selling openers from the collection of a fellow Canadian collector who had passed away. Since my wife is Canadian I bought a couple of Canadian soda openers and also five American openers. Included were two "Stanley" soda openers. Phil told me that like American beer openers Canadian beer openers are getting very tough to find. If any large amounts become available it is through dispersal of a collection. Phil did not show his openers for sale again until the Saturday show and at that time sold quiet a few to JFO members.

That evening I went with Harold and Boots Queen to a local German restaurant and the food was excellent. It was about 8:00 when we returned and I made the room-to-room trading rounds again. The hotel rooms were very nice and laid out in a U shape with two floors on the side and four floors in the rear. NABA had 90 percent (about 240 members attended) of the hotel so you had to cover the whole hotel to see everyone's room. Later that night I made a trade with Larry Moter. He received 4 tough "E"s and I got an A-34-5 Reading in Good condition, a B-52-UL Wiedemann in Fair and an A-29 Pepsi in Good condition. Larry always turns up a lot of good traders and it is getting real tough to find "E"s for him. But that is what makes opener collecting a lot fun (hunting for those tough openers). I turned in around midnight after a long day.

Thursday was tour day for NABA members (the Pabst Mansion and the Miller Brewing Co) but I stayed back at the hotel. I finally found an easy way to beat Norm Jay to the good openers at a convention. Get him involved with a poker game. He had played the night before and spent several hours Thursday playing. It was up to Verne Vollrath and myself (Harold and Don Whelan went on the tour) to turn up the good openers as more NABA members checked in. I spent the morning talking with Verne and listing and photographing his 1997 additions and new discoveries. That afternoon more rooms were open and I picked up a couple of nice A-24-2 Miller openers with full paint, a few more soda openers and some "B" beer openers.

The first night I was by myself but Thursday and Friday nights John Bitterman would be sharing the room with me. John is a new JFO member who has collected breweriana for 10 years specializing in Illinois beer items. He has been a regular Norm Jay customer since he started collecting and has reached the juncture of wanting to get rid of some undesirable items. He pretty much filled up the room with what he had brought to sell. Everything from micro coasters to plastic clocks. Too bad Art Santen wasn't there for the clocks. That evening the Miller Brewing Co. sponsored a buffet supper and the guest speaker from Miller gave a good talk about the brewing history in America and what was in store for the future. After supper I did some trading with Don Whelan and tried to keep the room open to sell some of John's rare collectibles. There is a good market for new micro brewery collectibles but the plastic from the 50's and 60's is hard sell.

Friday is the big NABA Auction day. That morning I went to a seminar on "How To Place A Dollar Value On Your Breweriana" (I sure wish the corkscrew collectors would do one on corkscrews sometime). Tom Hug, a prominent breweriana dealer, conducted the seminar. The two keys are "scarcity and condition". Good items are getting hard to find (I guess it's true in any collectible field). The micro brewery collectibles are providing a new niche but the good old items are slowly but surely disappearing.

Other points made were that if you want a Wisconsin breweriana item you go to Wisconsin and remember that local advertising almost always brings the highest price in the area it is from. Most everyone present agreed that breweriana shows provide a better source than auctions and patience is certainly needed for today's collector.

The auction started at noon with previewing from 11:00 to 12:00. One of the new rules was that items had to have a \$50 minimum and therefore no openers or corkscrews were offered in the auction. A lot of nice signs and high-dollar breweriana was offered but I only stayed a short time. Norm Jay lost out on a mug he was interested in and we ended up at my room. Norm had brought a new discovery knife and some additions for me to photograph. After going back and forth at ECBA and a couple of days here at NABA Norm traded me a Budweiser letter opener and a B-22-109 Flower City for a C-13-141 Kessler and a C-12-UL Frank's Beer and I had to throw in a G-5-13 Gund. Hopefully part of the deal covered the cab fare from the airport. Later in the afternoon JFO member Henry Smith came up with a proposition for me. I had a P-2 Gerke (from John Horn's collection) that he wanted. Henry had spotted some corkscrews at a nearby antique mall and wanted to take me to see them. If I bought some corkscrews he wanted the P-2 Gerke as a finder fee. I got Harold Queen to go along and Henry's wife Linda was nice enough to drive us to the mall. There were some nice corkscrews and champagne taps at very fair prices but not any real unusual items and I passed on buying anything. As Henry said you never know until you check it out.

Friday evening was the official NABA convention banquet. I set with the Whelans, the Queens and Larry Moter. JFO member Fil Graff stepped down as NABA president and Norm Jay was installed as Vice-President. Since this was the 25th NABA convention the keynote speech was a trip down memory lane of the previous 24 conventions. That evening I stayed mostly in the room trying to sell off more of John Bitterman's stuff. Being a young guy John never gave up on checking out other rooms (he was smart enough to carry a motel room layout and mark on it the rooms he had been in). We finally turned in about 1:00.

We were up early Saturday morning. Set-up for the public show started at 8:00 and nobody can start before that time. I checked out of the room after helping John move his stuff out. At 8:00 everyone started rolling in the show room and I did buy some more openers from Phil Mandzuk as several JFO members gathered around his table buying openers. Most of the items had been displayed in rooms but I did see a nice A-9-17 Schell for \$75.00 but passed on it at that price.

Joe and Jackie Young had graciously offered to let me spend Saturday night with them. They were driving up from Elgin, IL and would be picking me up at nine. Even though the public would not be let in until 10:00, Joe came in a few minutes to see the JFO members and we were gone by 9:30. The game plan called for a trip to the Kane County Flea market which opened at 12:30. Elgin was 2 hours from Waukesha and the Youngs just live 10 minutes from Kane County. We managed to check out an antique mall along the way and arrived at Kane County at 12:45. Like most Flea Markets it is not as good as it once was but for a first timer I did embarrassing well. Joe and Jackie were nice enough to point out several good openers for sale. I ended up getting following items: A-4-9 Leisy (VG), A-4-34 Joliet Citizens (EX), A-35-39 Farmers (VG), A-XX Holsum Bread (G), B-27-5 Asterweiss (VG), B-XX (Knife Sharpener & Opener) 1933-34 World's Fair (EX), C-12-UL Lithia Beer (EX), C-13-199 White Eagle (VG), E-6 Supreme Soda (G) and an E-14-295 Walter (G).

1996 NABA Convention Waukesha, WI July 31st to Aug 4th (Continued)

A good haul and I figured I certainly did better here than if I had stayed at the NABA show. I was feeling real good. Joe and Jackie only turned up a couple of small corkscrews and after about 3 hours we headed to their house. After resting for a few minutes Jackie signed me on their computer and I checked out Don Bull's "Corkscrews For Sale" list. Don has a lot of nice corkscrews and corkscrew knives for sale (quiet a few have been sold but he continually ads to the list). After a nice supper at a local restaurant, Joe and Jackie gave me a tour of downtown Elgin. We went by the gambling boat and Joe and I went into the local micro brewery. I asked the sales girl if they had any bottle openers for sale. She said, "bottle openers", real slow and with a quizzical look on her face like what's a bottle opener. I told her thanks and we left.

Back at the house Joe completed his corkscrew tour of what I had not seen back in April. After a couple of hours of seeing many unusual and interesting corkscrews I was getting pretty tired. Joe had covered his corkscrew collection very well and the 4000 different can openers would have to wait for another time. We were up early the next morning as I needed to be at the airport by 8:30. Joe showed me some interesting corkscrew books from his library. It is amazing how many beautiful variations exist. They had me at O'Hare by 8:30 and I spent 90 minutes waiting for my flight watching CNN. I did find out that since I had not made the first leg of my flight from Milwaukee to Chicago that American had cancelled the rest of my flight. I was mad but they flew me standby and I made my original flight even though it was sold out. I arrived back in Durham at 1:15 and another successful convention came to an end.

I would be remiss if I did not extend a big thank you to Herb and Helen Haydock who hosted the NABA convention. They did a wonderful job, the facilities were excellent and everything went off without a hitch. Herb was one of the original founders of NABA and also one of the original members of JFO. Other JFO members attending that I did not mention in the article were Dave Gausepohl, Jim Maxwell, Ken Ostrow and Larry Sherk.

Hillsville, VA Labor Day Flea Market

I was up at 3:40 Friday morning to get ready for the big day ahead. I left the house and picked up Roger Jarrell at 5:10. It was about 2 & 1/2 hours to Hillsville and after 20 minutes in traffic we parked at 8:00. We always try to get to Lou Sutton's (a member of JFO who sets up as a dealer) booth early. Lou didn't have many good openers this time and all I bought was a C-12 ginger ale but Roger did get a P-8-UL Chattanooga for \$30.00. The day would tend to go like this. I found some soda openers, no beer openers were turning up and Roger got the good items when they did appear. He got an N-40-UL belt buckle from Lone Star, a really nice N-4 1933 Chicago's World's Fair knife and opener and finally a Cliquot Club ginger ale combination opener and corkscrew. He said two well known breweriana dealers were set up (Jody Farra and Ray Johnson) and they had been there since Wednesday. Larry then told me what all he had found. A B-21-UL King's Bohemian, a C-31-1 Gold Bond, several other A's and B's, a tough West Virginia blob-top bottle and finally a Hoster mini-mug. That certainly explained why I didn't find much. When I did mention the E-6 Superior, Larry was like "you mean I missed one". In any event we ended up doing some trading and I did get the B-21 and C-31. Oh well there is always next year except it looks like Don Bull may be moving permanently to his Virginia summer home which is 60 miles from Hillsville. There goes all of the corkscrews and knives.

She can't explain his strong addiction to collecting, but says we should see his other collections. Where is it that you put things to decorate your home, Shirley???

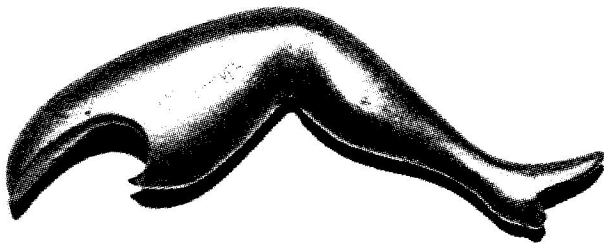
Spouse's Corner (Continued)

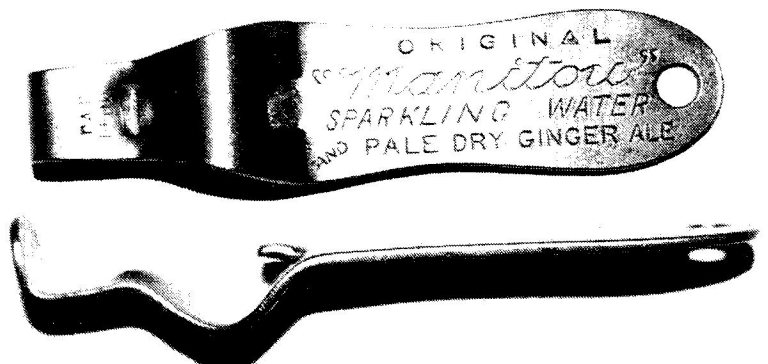

Leg with "Comp. Of C. Bremeyer"

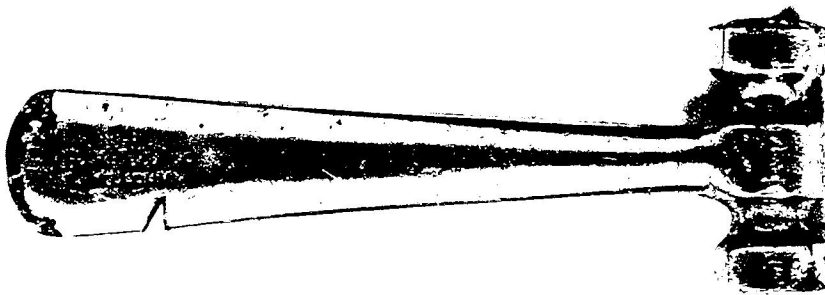
