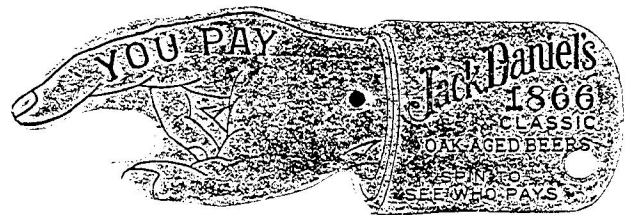
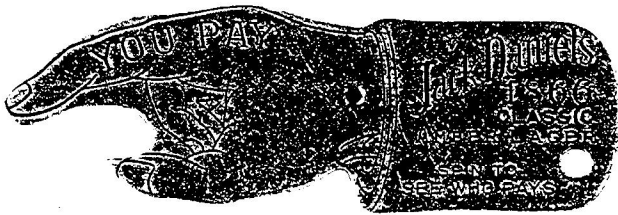

"Opener Trivia"

From the last issue I did not get an answer to Larry Moter's questions about his E-9 "Bavaria Bogota / Same". Mark Barren turned up a L-UL-UL Iroquois just like Mickey and Ellie Dutcher had in the last issue (see 1998 New Discoveries). From a couple of issues back Sandra Emme had an E-11 with the initials A.B.C.B. Washington D.C. and wanted to know what they stood for. A recent eBay auction provided the answer as a 1936 Bottler's List being sold listed members for the "American Bottlers of Carbonated Beverages" convention in Washington D.C.

First thing on the agenda is to once again warn members about a new spinner (A-21) being produced advertising Coca-Cola. Many sellers are advertising as being old or not mentioning that it is made in the last 2-3 years. Marc Benjamin brought to my attention that Jack Daniels has a second beer A-21 being produced. If you write Jack Daniels they will sell you this one (1866 Classic Oak-Aged Beer) versus the original (1866 Classic Amber Lager). A fourth spinner and like the Coca-Cola opener, a fantasy item, is being sold as a keepsake from a Nevada Prostitute House (The Chicken Ranch (Pic of Heart)). Coca-Cola did not authorize this spinner and I doubt the Chicken Ranch did (but I am not sure about this one). In any case people are selling these as old when they are not.



A phone conversation with Thom Thompson produced more information about the new A-21 spinners. He knows the man who had them made up and the producer does not know how who is making them. The man gave Thom some identifying points so you will know they are not old. First he made the punch spot off center unlike original spinners, second they are brass colored and last the new editions have a sleeve line at the top of the opener (from the cuff to "You Pay") that is not on the original. Like the Jack Daniels openers I would assume these other two would be \$3-\$5 openers. They have sold for much more especially on eBay. Finally they seem to come from the west coast but are probably all over the country by now. Be careful and be alert.

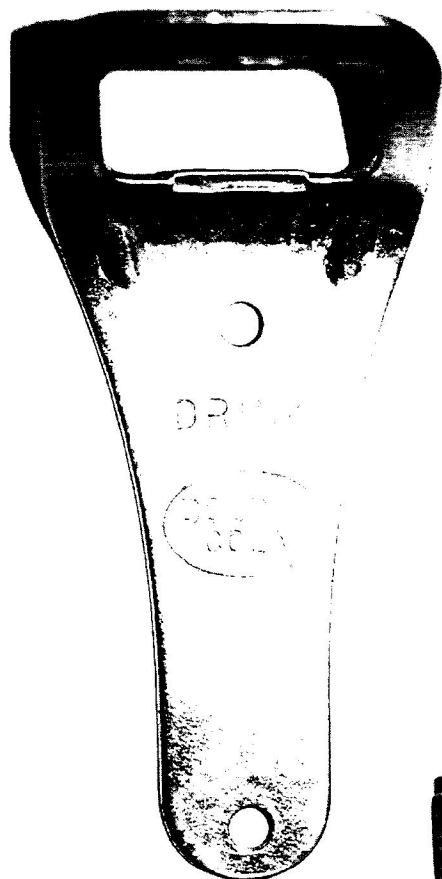

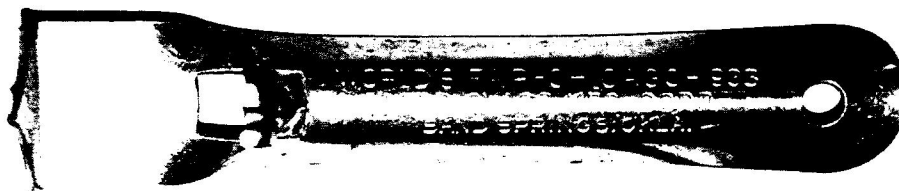
"Opener Trivia" (Continued)

From the last issue, Dale Deckert needs the Brown Wall Mount shown, so it must be tough. No one else responded. A couple of Canadian collectors did inquire about the Mutz watch fob saying it was the first one they had seen with Mutz advertising. No one responded about the H-1s. Thanks to everyone who did respond.

Below are two pieces I received in trade from Norm Jay. The one on the left is a B-9 opener/cigar box opener advertising Corbin and picturing a large screw. Does anyone have information on Corbin and what the screw connection is? To the right was a previously unknown to me "B" type from "Big Diamond Milling Co Minneapolis". Norm traded me one at ABA and the very next month Ken Ostrow had one for sale at ECBA. A new style and two turn up in less than a month. Does anyone else have one and is it the same advertising?



Left is a unusual soda wall mount for "Double Cola". It is basically a C-19 with the opener end bent 45 degrees. Anyone could bend the opener but this one has two reinforcing ribs. Has anyone seen this style and do they have one with advertising besides Double Cola? Below right top is a 1933 Chicago World's Fair bottle opener and can opener for Kerr Glass Mfg. Corp. of Sand Springs, Okla. At least I believe it is a can opener at one end. That end comes to a sharp point. Has anyone seen this one and know any background? Finally at the bottom right is one of great eBay buys. It was advertised as a "Coors Tap Knob with a Bottle Opener". Counting shipping I paid \$25 figuring I had a New Discovery "T" type. When it arrived I was amazed to find that the opener is encased in Lucite. From the picture you think you can actually use the opener but it is there just for looks. You can't win them all.

ABA 17 th Annual Convention Eau Claire, WI (June 16 th -21 st 1998) (by Editor)

It was a busy morning at work as I was attending to last minute details. At 11:00 I had a quick lunch at my favorite restaurant in Chapel Hill, "The Rat". As several members mentioned we had a mini JFO Convention. While Norm set-up the room I decided to start checking out rooms. I did end up selling Larry an F-7-3 Bub with a red handle. Don Sherman flew in from Los Angeles and he went to supper that night with Norm and me. Room-to-room activity was pretty heavy that night and ABA always has a nice hospitality room.

Thursday saw more check-ins but I spent most of the day sitting in the room waiting for Norm to return from one of his appointments. He had several and would usually come back with some good openers among other things. One appointment he bought 35 openers for a dollar each and needed five for his collection. I didn't find much but wound up socializing with the JFO crowd and watching the room. The hotel was spread out and had a separate round tower. Later that afternoon I was walking with Norm and John Bitterman and they kept going in a circle in the round tower. On one floor I went the opposite direction from them and found a room with six opener for sale as a lot. One of the openers just happened to be an A-54-2 Walters. Phil told me I had already seen them but Don Whelan and Ollie Hibbeler got some fairly nice openers at a good price. That afternoon I even completed a trade with Art Santen. I traded him a K-13 Schlitz for a B-9-9 Pederson. The Pederson was rough but when I got home it really cleaned up nice. That evening I went really crazy and bought \$15 worth of plastic from Art. Ollie says I have lied for the first time as I broke my vow not to mess with the new stuff. Oh well we all go over the deep end sometime. ECBA 27th Annual Convention Rochester, NY (July 15th-19st 1998)

It seemed like a repeat of ABA except I was leaving work on Wednesday instead of Tuesday. A quick lunch at my favorite Chapel Hill restaurant and Pat had me to the airport at 12:00 for my 12:30 flight to Rochester. I changed planes in Cincinnati and landed in Rochester at 4:15. The hotel for the ECBA convention was a six story Holiday Inn Holidrome. The roof over the atrium area was see through and the temperature the next few days matched inside and out, hot!

I was sharing a room this time with Bob Kay who is the foremost beer label authority in the country. Bob had already checked into the room and I wanted to see who was open for business even though most folks were at supper. Ken Ostrow (JFO member and breweriana dealer) had saved an unusual "B" style opener for me (see Opener Trivia). Besides that he had been picked pretty clean already by Norm Jay and Larry Moter. Other JFO members in attendance were Harold Queen, Chuck King, Herb Haydock, Dave Gausepohl and arriving on Friday would be Tom Atkinson.

Wednesday night Mark Barren drove over from Buffalo and made the room-to-room rounds. We had a deal working but he wanted to wait until Thursday night to complete it. In fact I bought very little Wednesday, with the main purchase being a matchsafe with a pretty girl and advertising a clothier from New York City. Larry Moter and I completed a four openers for four wire openers deal. I got an unusual Kerr Glass Co bottle opener/jar opener combo, a C-31 cigar box opener (non-beer), a F-5 Dr Pepper (in poor condition) and a G-3 Texas Co (forerunner of Texaco). Larry received an E-6-133 Dixie, E-7-47 Drewry, E-14-546 Schell and an E-23-UL Tivoli. The main highlight was watching my roommate, Bob Kay, complete a mini-bottle/label deal with Angelo Piccone. They had to recompute everything three times before completing the deal. Thankfully Bob had a calculator. We turned in about 12:30.

Thursday was pretty slow during the day. Rooms would open up sporadically. My best buy was a K-5-UL Old Milwaukee in real condition. That afternoon and evening, the action picked up quite a bit. Mark traded me an E-17-13 Oneida for a couple of tough New York "B"s. Harold Queen and I completed a trade. He got an unlisted M-3 slide-out non-beer with a masonic symbol, an O-4 Coca-Cola and a C-13 Vaughan piece used to sharpen knives. I received a roundlet corkscrew with an opener attached to the end, a B-18 Coca-Cola opener, an unusual cigar cutter combo key ring and a B-53 Soda Bottling Co opener. Former JFO member, Rich Alonso, sold me three openers, the best being an unlisted A-29 Pabst from a New Jersey distributor. I bought a couple of more openers from Ken Ostrow, a B-33-2 Heilemann and an M-2 Pureoxia Ginger Ale. That completed my dealing for Thursday. In fact we turned in about 10:30 to make up for the late night before.

ECBA had more functions planned for Friday and during the day, few rooms were open. I did have a visit from JFO member Dick Bestard. He now resides in California but was back in Rochester visiting family. We discussed openers for a couple of hours and he had several suggestions for redoing the handbook. I told Dick at this point, it would not be smart coming up with a new numbering system. The best plan was just to leave the listings the way they are. We had a nice visit and even toured all six floors checking out rooms. I did find a F-9-1 Cleveland and Sandusky at a good price (\$25).

After the Friday night banquet Tom Atkinson arrived. We got down to some serious trading as he had brought along a number of openers from a small collection. He wanted the corkscrew I got from Harold and after some wheeling and wheeling agreed to the following trade.

He got the corkscrew and I received a B-19-102 Salem, E-22-1 Frontenac, E-26-UL Mass Brew, E-27-UL Pfeiffer, H-1-UL Enterprise, N-43 Coca-Cola, N-10 Country Club Ginger Ale, P-5-1 A-B and some money. It was a nice corkscrew as it turned out. By now I could say I had a good convention. That evening my roommate even sold me a pre-pro pencil from Virginia Brewing Co. of Roanoke, VA.

Friday also completed the ECBA display room which is run by Ken Ostrow. I brought a P-30 Hinckel from Albany, NY to display. The previous weekend I had visited Don Bull near Roanoke, VA and we had completed a trade for it and several other items. It is a small world in that Don had traded for the piece at the 1980 ECBA convention (see JFO issue #8 Oct 1980). Don had traded a lot of good types for it to Scott Parzanese. Well Scott was in attendance this year and enjoyed seeing his former corkscrew being displayed.

Saturday morning was the ECBA business meeting and we had some discussion about the number of bus tours being done versus allowing for more room-to-room trading. Nothing was resolved and at 9:30 the public show started. I bought a few miscellaneous openers, but nothing real good. JFO member Bill Arber came by the show and Dick Bestard made the rounds also. As with any convention by Saturday you have seen most everything and this show was no exception.

I spent the afternoon packing and getting ready for my 6:30 morning flight back home. Norm and Judy Jay were good supper company and for once Norm and I did not complete a trade. He did sell me a P-17-2 Berghoff for future credit. NABA was right around the corner. Bob Kay got me to the airport by 5:30 and I was back in Durham by 10:00 Sunday morning. Cleaning up my ECBA haul took most of Sunday afternoon and I also started thinking about the NABA convention scheduled for August 5-9 in Columbus, OH.

NABA 26th Annual Convention Columbus, OH (August 5th-9st 1998)

For the first time in 1998 we were driving to a major show (not counting Blue-Grey). Pat as always had plenty of clothes, extra gear and "Corkie The Yorkie". I still managed to load a few small boxes of openers. We left Durham at 1:00 in the afternoon and eight and one-half hours later arrived in Columbus. NABA is for the big-time collectors and small guys and I figured we needed to be at this one early. Only about 10 rooms were open that night and as usual I was trailing behind Larry Moter who had arrived earlier that evening. He had already purchased a nice A-42 Gold Top.

Ken Ostrow got me started with a nice E-7-2 Burkhardt for \$10. Late in the evening I did some trading with Larry and I had some soda wires he wanted and he had picked up a nice B-1-29 Burkhardt's from Akron, OH. It was midnight before we turned in and one of the good things about this hotel was the air conditioning worked well. (Pat agrees with Norm, John keeps the room freezing-even for a Canadian).

Wednesday was slow starting. Rooms opened up slowly during the morning and things picked up more quickly after lunch. NABA officially had 261 members in attendance. The first three floors were pretty full. JFO members attending were John Bitterman, John Ferguson, Dave Gausepohl, Fil Graff, Herb Haydock, Norm Jay, Vic Kroll, George Love, Larry Moter, Ken Ostrow, Harold Queen, Jim Shoulter, John Stanley and Verne Vollrath. Fil Graff, Norm Jay and Verne Vollrath had brought small boxes of openers for the new Bull and Stanley book, "Beer Advertising Openers and Corkscrews". A lot of one of a kind known openers and corkscrews.

NABA 26 th Annual Convention Columbus, OH (August 5 th -9 st 1998) (Continued)

As the afternoon progressed I found several miscellaneous openers but nothing too good. I was having better luck finding openers for George Love. He collects Chattanooga and any openers advertising "Bond and Lillard", a family name. That evening my luck changed as Vic Kroll opened up. George Love was ahead of me and bought a few but got 11 openers from Vic. Among these were a B-42-9 R&H, B-60-4 Feigenspan, F-29-2 Crema Malt, M-54-6 Pabst and an N-18-1 Oshkosh along with several miscellaneous. George Love bought a G-9-UL Lubeck (Gold on Black) which I was able to talk him out of later in the show. A lot of rooms were opening up and I finally spotted a B-18-534 Palmetto Beer from Knoxville. That was the good news. The bad news was it was \$100. The opener has been near the top of my Southern opener want list. The owner agreed to cut it to \$85. What a deal, so I jumped at the bargain and in the process set a known record for a B-18, B-19, B-21 or B-22 (pre-pro key openers). Not a record I want to own but at this stage of the game, when will or will I ever see another. I thought Harold Queen owned the record but he corrected me the next night. A B-21-122 Ortlieb had sold in one the Don Bull auctions in the late 80s for \$70 and Harold eventually got it from the person who paid that amount. But Harold traded for it. If anyone has another rare "B"s, please contact Pat so she can buy it for a Christmas gift for yours truly (sorry John, see Spouse's Corner-I only know about A-1s). Wednesday night was good when Jim Shoulter, who is moving to Alabama, brought several good openers and non-beer advertising items for sale. I got some really neat collectibles, including an icepick advertising laxatives (if the laxatives don't work do you use the icepick?).

Thursday saw many more arrivals. Pat and I went with Verne and Laverne Vollrath to the nearby Anheuser-Busch gift store. Your editor spent \$28 on plastic openers and Pat was feared another "Captain Corkscrew" was being born. She can understand old openers but what good is plastic. I kept telling her I was expanding my horizons. Verne also spent some money on plastic and was getting the same response from LaVerne. I will never catch up to Art Santen and Dale Deckert in having the most openers if I don't expand into plastic. A few openers turned up but this show was turning out not to be opener heaven. Late in the afternoon JFO member Hugh Preacher drove over from Dayton and purchased over 50 soda and beer openers I had brought. Hugh is a relative newcomer but has accumulated a nice selection of beer and soda openers. That evening we went with Boots and Harold Queen to supper as Harold informed me he did not own the record for highest priced "B-18-19-21-22" opener. Harold and I did some trading afterwards as I had some soda "C"s he wanted and he had an unusual N-4 soda knife advertising "Pop Kola and Tick Tock" from Atlanta. Norm Jay and I completed a mug trade started at ABA in Eau Claire. John Bitterman sold me a nice E-1 Pepsi Cola opener from Joliet, IL. Once again it was a late night for going to bed.

Friday at a NABA convention is auction day. That day Pat, Corkie and went to Cincinnati to visit Ardea Horn. Ardea was doing fairly well in a new house and her children live close by. She had kept John Horn's treasured collection of M-1s, M-2s, C-1s and C-2s. I needed to borrow several pieces for the upcoming type book. We arrived about 11:30 and had a nice two and a half hour visit. Ardea's dog, Silky, liked Corkie very much but Corkie being only two was not sure what to make of her. I picked out six pieces to use for the book and took pictures of each one in the display. We left Cincinnati about 2:30 and despite a traffic jam back in Columbus we arrived back at the hotel about 5:15. I invited George Love down to check out the openers I had brought for sale. It was the third day of the convention and this was the first time he saw what I had. We completed a deal for a Chattanooga matchsafe and he bought a few miscellaneous openers and I got the G-9-UL Lubeck from him. Friday night was the official NABA banquet. JFO member Jim Shoulter was the outgoing president and Norm Jay was elected the new one. Some after dinner JFO conversation finished up Friday.

The trade floor opened early Saturday and everyone scrambled to fill up the tables. With diligent searching I only found a B-2-30 Hanley that Ken Ostrow had for sale. I had traded mine off a couple of years ago and it was time to replace it. The price was right at \$40 (for excellent condition). We had decided to head back to North Carolina and after loading up the truck and saying good-byes, we left Columbus about 11:00. The trip home was uneventful except for finding a B-49 Pulaski Bank (from VA) for \$2 at a Wytheville, VA antique mall. I had been all through the mall and the opener caught my eye just as I was going out the door. Despite Pat making a wrong turn (she couldn't wake me up as I was in "Opener Dream World"), we were back home by 8:00 that night. This completed the big beer shows for 1998. Next stop will be the Blue-Grey in February in Fredricksburg, VA.

Spouse's Corner

I noted that it looked like someone from Fil Graff's family couldn't remember how to spell their name or set up the text to be engraved from batch to batch. They made 6 very similar openers. One was listed in ('78), 2 ('79), the next one in ('86), another in ('89) and the last one in ('95). As a curious novice, I wondered if the latest ones are harder to find because fewer were produced or whatever else might be a factor. Then I asked to be forgiven because the Grafs got quite original during prohibition. Just look at the name for 52nd listing. Could this be the same Graf's? Sorry, Fil, your name was on my mind after setting up an email mailbox for NABA.

The alpha order hi-lites those companies that only issued one opener, like the A-1 #1, Argonaut Beer San Francisco. Wish I had known that a few months ago!

I then read the WHOLE list of A-1s. It was fun! Hey, I'm a Canadian, so I wondered if John has a #54, "Fit for a King" Royal Canadian Jr., The Small Can with the Big Punch? Decided to flip back to my table of information I included in October '97 issue to see how valuable this one is. Not bad, so I added one on my wish list.

As I completed the review of this list, I saw several others that I could relate to people or places I know. These connections add a personal dimension to the hobby, one that is often the single focus of a collector.

Corkie and I then signed off. As always, we had enjoyed this little diversion from our more mundane life.

Sunday morning, John started giving me more information, taking his A-1 display off the wall for me to study, marking past issues of the newsletter which provided more information on A-1s and even located a copy of an old catalog that would be of interest to me. This is the most time he has ever taken to share his hobby with me. It has been delightful. Take note collectors, your spouse may really want to know about your hobby. (Maybe he will explain football to me next!)

So, most of my draft was "scratched" to bring a much more informative column to you.

Spouse's Corner by Pat Stanley (Continued)

John had one A-1 from a manufacturer, "Crown Throat and Opener Company". When I inquired about this one I found out that there is an Opener Manufacturer List in the front of the Handbook. Member #339 (John Stanley) submitted the listing for this company established in 1910.

Hopefully, you have the good fortune to have the July 1982 JFO newsletter, for Don Bull told the history of the A-1. It all began with a painting by the French artist, Paul Chabas (1869-1937) named "September Morn". When Don visited Jack Ford in California, he discovered that Jack had a copy of that painting. Information from Jack and further investigation by Don made the A-1s more meaningful to me. In 1913, the painting was first exhibited in the United States and Braun & Co. received a copyright to produce an opener. This one, which I actually held today from John's collection, is a high relief opener made in brass. It is actually an A-40. In 1914 Harry L. Vaughan was granted a design patent for the A-1 which is a flat nickel-plated opener. The patent was assigned to the Crown Throat and Opener Company in Chicago. A clothed version appeared in the design drawings. Who undressed her is still a mystery. The A-40 more closely represents the copy of the painting shown in Bull's article.

Next John showed me the Card of A-1 Vaughan Openers (from the Collection of Thom Thompson) included in the October 1995 newsletter. Crown Throat and Opener Company was later known as Vaughan Openers (good change Harry). At the bottom of the card, something about a dozen asst. 2'22 was not quite legible. You know me, had to know what the numbers referred to. So, John went back to his little collection room and came out with a copy of Vaughan Novelty Mfg. Co. Catalog No. 26 with instructions not to lose it. No. 21 was the Mermaid and No. 22 was the Bathing Girl in their catalog. In the 30s, the Bathing Girl became the Surf Girl. I knew those numbers were important.

John must know I'm writing about Bull and Thompson. He has talked to them both today, while I work away on "his" newsletter. I should start listening to those conversations. I could probably learn even more!

A whole new interest is growing. I picked up each A-1 John has in his display with new meaning. I discovered how many San Francisco openers he has and how many other California companies. He knew I was really studying them when I told him #37 is listed incorrectly. The word "Drink" is not on the opener. Thought #25 was wrong too, as "Compliments of" is quite tricky to see on the opener. Some were not in the handbook (of beer openers), so I learned more about those when I inquired. One of his favorites is the Louis Ortell's 1-2-3-4 Bar, Rock Island, Illinois. Two sodas had left his collection at one time, to return later through trades or some deal. Jack Ford once had the Chero-Cola and Bill Ennis once had the Cream of Cola opener John originally found on one of his trips to Hillsville, Virginia Labor Day show. John later said that they both may have come from that show.

John brought out a Canadian listing that is not in United States handbook, "Ask for Fernie Beer from British Columbia". Next he showed me one from Graf's since I had earlier given Fil some grief about that brewery. Now, I must really ask forgiveness, as this one is really neat. It's the opener attached to a little bottle by a chain.

#s 16 and 80 are from Montana. I know to think of Bill Pattie when I see that state. Wonder if these were his at one time, or maybe ones he wants.
