**1999 Convention Naples, FL (21<sup>st</sup> JFO Convention) (April 21-25 1999)**

Tuesday afternoon and as usual I am scrambling around trying to get ready for the "Big Convention". A last minute decision to fly instead of drive has meant I cannot take much in the way of openers. One small duffel bag of openers counting my display, but it is quality not quantity that counts.

"Corkie the Yorkie" would be staying with friends and since we were staying six days Pat was carrying enough luggage for an army. As is always the case airport security wanted to check out the opener bag. The security lady got a big laugh checking out some of the openers and really freaked when I show her a copy of Don Bull's *Pocket Guide to Corkscrews*. She yells out they even have a book on this stuff. Finally she told us to go on as everyone in the area was looking by now.

We had a two hour stopover in Orlando and I spent the time reading Don's latest book. Once again an outstanding book for collectors. Don't leave home without a copy. Easy to carry and like his large book it has prices. We arrived safely in Fort Myers at 10PM and were greeted by Art and Eileen Johnson. After a 30 minute trip to Naples we were at the motel and in our room by 11:00. I did make a quick call to Gary Deachman as he had arrived the day before. We agreed to meet for breakfast the next morning.

Wednesday was a fairly cool day with low humidity. We would not be so lucky the rest of the week. Gary, Pat and I walked down the road a couple of blocks to a small diner for breakfast. The food was okay except for the worst biscuits I have ever tasted. Maybe they tasted bad because Gary tells me he had already hit Dale Deckert's room and got the only three good openers he had. JFO Convention is getting like the other beer shows, you just can't get there early enough (keep that thought in mind when registering next year in Chicago). Gary didn't think I would have any of the three and I actually had two of them. All three were a little unusual with two of them being Coca-Cola and one Pepsi-Cola. We complete the first trade of the convention as he gets a A-57 Blatz and an I-25 Northampton and I get the Pepsi wall mount, a F-2-UL Krueger and some money.

Later on Dale's room is open. He brought a bunch of figural wall mounts with most being his own production models. We have to complete a trade as I owed him some openers. He gets some good wall mounts including an O-18 Coca-Cola, an unusual style steel plate made by B&B, a cast iron Brown Mfg. Opener (top of page 4 1998 July JFO issue), and an O-9 Stegmaier. I did leave with a "rare" gold-plated O-5 Coca-Cola wall mount. That is rare according to Dale. Knowing there are millions more out there really made me feel good.

Pat and I had a quick glimpse of the hospitality room the night before. Bob and his girlfriend, Gloria Counts, had the place set up nice that morning. He had a good selection of openers and corkscrews for sale but I was having to battle Dale to get the good ones. Even though Dale had to use a walker, he was getting his share. I ended up with a O-4 7Up and a small 3-D nude woman opener. Dale got the big fish and that was a "Happy Hooligan" opener from the 1930s. He paid Bob \$250 for a rough condition one only to learn when he got home he already had a mint one. That is what happens when you have 40,000 openers in your collection. You just can't remember every one. I have a hard enough time keeping up with 2500. Most of Wednesday afternoon was spent greeting new arrivals and checking out rooms. By late Wednesday night 20 of the eventual 27 attendees had checked in. Several first time arrivals were already there including Odis Jones, John Burruss III and Fred Steffens.

Pat and I along with Gary Deachman were invited to have dinner at Art and Eileen Johnson's house. Eileen fixed a wonderful meal with roast beef, lobster and all of the fixings. She even had a lemon meringue pie. It seemed like I ate as much as everyone else put together but it sure was good. Art even allowed me to check on the latest eBay offerings on the computer. By 8:00 we were back at the motel and it was time to do some trading with Don Whelan. I had a A-54-1 A-B and a P-53-5 Schlitz that Don wanted while he had a M-73 Hotel Kessler (yellow), a B-53-1 Gipps and some miscellaneous openers. After a few minutes of haggling I removed a B-22-9 Jettlers from my want pile and we completed the deal. As this was going on a lot of members were going through Don's openers. He always has a nice selection of traders and several people left his room happy.

Don also reported on the way to the convention he had stopped at a lot of antique malls. Not once but twice he found nice openers and both times the attendants could not get the cases opened. The first time at a St. Louis mall he had found the elusive O-5 Schlitz mint in the box. Fortunately his son lives in St. Louis and was able to finally get the opener a couple days later. In Louisville, KY a nice type could not be removed from the case and Don had to leave it. He did not say what the opener was but all of us JFO members go to Louisville and buy it. It happens but rarely twice on one trip.

Bob and Gloria kept the hospitality room open until about 11:00. In addition to registering people Bob was running a raffle for a local cancer society. For \$1 you got to guess how many bottle caps were in a large jar. Half of the proceeds went to the winner and half to the cancer society. Eileen Johnson was the eventual winner with a guess of 1155 and the actual total being 1154. Way to go Eileen.

Thursday brought in the late arrivals, Ollie and Shirley Hibbeler along with Dave Lendy. I spent most of the morning checking out John Burruss's soda and beer openers as he brought a lot of new additions for each book. Bob Post also brought several new additions to the handbook for me to check out and had me foaming over a couple of them, a B-9 Ambrosia and an O-4 Storz. As I always say they had to make more than one or at least I hope they did.

That afternoon Vic Kroll checked into his room and started unloading a lot of large boxes. He had been selling a lot of nice beer openers the last few years at beer shows and I was hoping this would be no different. He did not disappoint anyone. Several of us waited in anticipation. Finally at 4:30 I was walking about his room, which was just around the corner from the hospitality room, when I noticed the door cracked open and Bob Post was sitting in there talking to Vic. I entered and immediately started going through his little boxes of openers. He had several and at first Bob Post was nice enough to let me go through a box and then he would check out the same box. After a couple like this Bob said, I will go through a different one, as Vic had about 5 or 6 boxes of openers.

My pile was starting to get big as I was nearing the end of my search. Vic totaled up the openers I wanted and it came to \$160 and he gave me a \$20 discount. He also let me check out four pieces he was holding out for the Friday auction. Very nice items and I knew I would be interested in a couple of them. I was leaving the room when I noticed another opener box separate from the others. It was on a bed among many notebooks full of beer advertising items (Vic basically deals in all breweriana). As it turned out this box had a lot of good "A"s and "B"s with the best being an A-33-4 Bechaud. Bob Post commented on how we had both missed it, but lucky for me I was first again.

Several other JFO members were now coming in his room, their hands reaching everywhere. My haul from this box totaled \$127 which Vic let me have for a \$100. Verne Vollrath got several good "B"s from Vic and one in particular was a B-23 Marshfield. Even though the brewery was only 40 miles from his home he had never found an opener from there in 20 plus years of collecting. Well he now owns one and it was in great shape to boot.

Now I could watch other people go after Vic's openers. Dale Deckert and Gary Deachman were among the participants and both accused me of getting the good stuff. In fact Dale was calling everyone "Jesse James" and Bob McNary said Dale must be "Frank James". Regardless everyone seemed to get some openers they liked. Gary also did well in the breweriana department as he had little competition for the non-opener items.

After all of the excitement a large group went to Mel's Diner. Besides the Missouri crowd we were joined by Pat's dad, George, and his wife, Mary. They had driven in for a couple of days to visit Pat and see how many more crazy people collect openers besides the son-in-law. That night I spent mainly socializing and most everyone turned by 11PM. Unlike early JFO conventions where quite a few would stay up until the early morning.

Friday started out hot and humid and it lasted all day long. That morning we organized the caravan car pool to The Sanibel Island Brewpub. Eight cars went and everyone arrived on time. I drove Ed and Eileen Kaye's car and Vic Keown rode with us. Ed and Eileen use to live on Sanibel Island and offered a lot of local knowledge. Lunch and beer were excellent as most everyone opted for the grouper fish special. The service was fast as we arrived at 11:30 and by 1:00 we were ready to leave. After a nice drive down the coastline back to Naples, we were back at the motel by 2:15 and it was time to get ready for the auction.

Verne and LaVerne were already preparing for the auction by taking consignments. For the first time at a JFO convention we would be having the auction outside under a tent. There was just enough of a breeze to make it bearable. The good openers being offered made it much more bearable. As usual Vern and LaVerne did their usual outstanding job. Bob McNary presented Vern and LaVerne with a plaque honoring them for their longtime service of running the JFO Auction. It was a very nice plaque with a gavel attached. Gary Deachman and I helped with the auction. We allowed up to five items in the auction and the following short list with results on the next page is of the better items.

After starting 4:00 the auction was over at 5:45. Several guys helped as we set up the tables for the following day public show. I then went with Pat and her parents to the Red Lobster a couple of doors down from the motel. The air conditioning inside felt good. That evening I completed a trade with Dave Lendy. He wanted the B-53-1 Gipps I got from Don Whelan. I ended up with some miscellaneous openers. Dave also bought a few "B" type beer openers. As with previous nights the hospitality room closed by 11:00 that night.

A very short business meeting was held and Chicago was officially announced as next year's convention site (see first page for details). Thanks were extended to Bob McNary and Gloria Counts along with thanks to Art and Eileen Johnson.

By 1:00 the show was pretty much over. Along with several of the spouses and Ollie Hibbeler, I opted for a two hour trolley ride tour of Naples. Our driver, Russ, was from Kokomo, Indiana and was worth the price of the tour. He placed a heavy accent on "R"s and had us laughing most of the way around. He called retirees, "re-tar-ees". They took us on another tour of Naples and Pat got to see one of the beautiful sunsets that Florida is known for. We spent some time at Art's house and I caught up on eBay going-ons. Art was successful late Sunday night buying a M-73 Electro-Chemical slide out corkscrew opener.

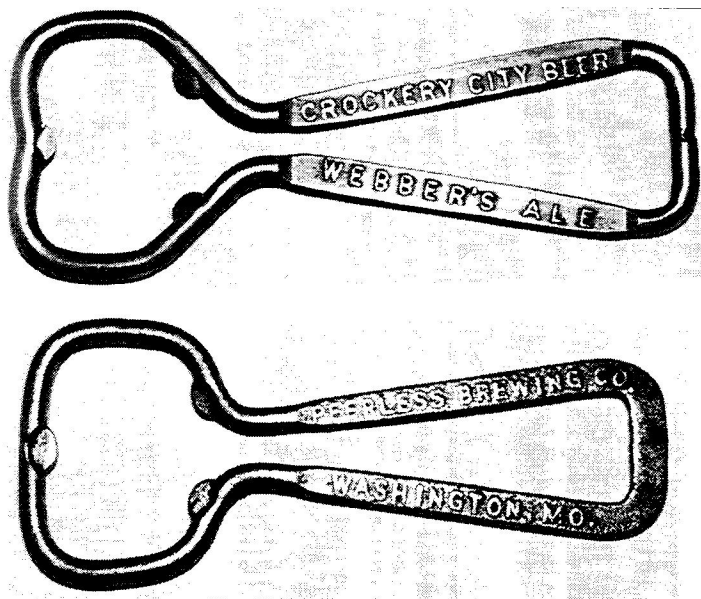
After further discussion with Don Bull about grading and not wanting to be different from other 10 point systems the grades will be broken down as follows:

**Grading (G): 1-Poor-Fair, 3-Good, 5-Very Good, 7-Excellent, 9-Near Mint, 10-Mint**

The JFO auction starting with the October issue will reflect this scale.

From the last issue just be warned one more time that Coca-Cola fake openers are really starting to turn up. Don Whelan is now the proud owner of the A-54 A-B opener via a convention trade. I received one endorsement (from Don Bull) to make Ed Schaefer's loop seal remover for bottles a New Discovery. Look for it again in the October issue probably as a "N" type.

The following three openers were purchases off eBay. The Chero-Cola fob was a great buy at \$40. It is Arthur Merrill's Oct 8, 1912 patent. The E-14-485 Crockery City at the top right is one that I have been trying to get for a long time. It came with several junk openers for \$30. The bottom right is an E-6-120 Peerless from Washington, MO. Another good buy at \$3.75. Shipping was additional but minimal in all three cases.

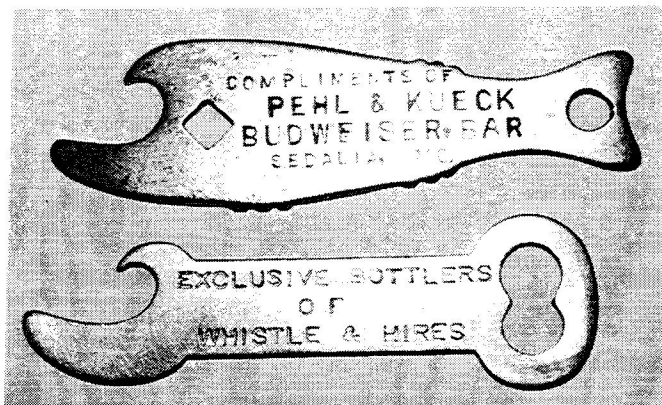

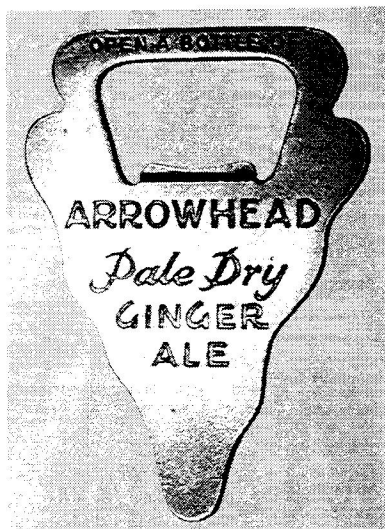

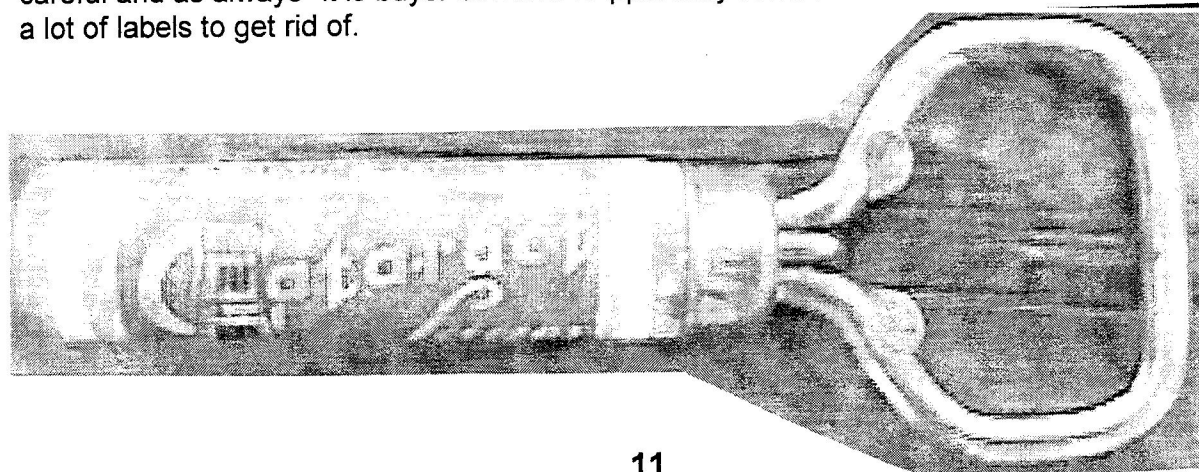

They all had mint or near mint labels, but the sleeves and opener/corkscrew parts were good to very good condition. I first saw these in North Carolina about 3-4 years ago. Be careful and as always "it is buyer beware!". Apparently someone has an abundance of time and a lot of labels to get rid of.

# Spouse's Corner

Members gathered for the JFO Convention always have a sparkle in their eye, happy to be with friends who they may only see once a year, but the time apart never is a factor.

We don't know the life story of the openers (up to the time a club member acquires them, then John Stanley knows their every transfer). We don't know the life story of other members unless we take time to listen. And when we do, we come away with some of their strength, their wisdom, their kindness, their love of life, their laughter, and a deep respect for them.

And lastly, it is always amusing to me, to watch John with his JFO friends. He is energized, seemingly aware of everyone, socializing, taking on the role of leader, walking and talking. He is somewhat like that with a handful of friends at work. Then I drag him to some event, where he knows no one, but me and it is always a shock to see the shy side of him, the side that wouldn't even say "hi" to the person next to him, if his life depended on it.

## **Fiesta Potato Salad (Outdoor Grill Cookbook)**

We sometimes have the pleasure of other JFO members visiting our home. Long after I had forgotten what I fixed when Marc and Pat Benjamin came up to Durham from the coast, I found out that Pat had shared one recipe with many others. The topic came up in the hospitality room in Naples and other spouses wanted the recipe too. Pat and Pat decided to include it here. When you fix this, think about JFO.

3 cups cold, diced, cooked potatoes	1/2 t. paprika
1/3 cup finely sliced green onions & tops	1/4 t. monosodium glutamate
6 slices crumbled bacon (I add more)	1/4 t. pepper
2 T. well drained pimientos	1/4 cup Kraft Catalina French dressing
1 t. salt	3/4 cup mayonnaise
3 hard-cooked eggs, sliced	

Toss everything but eggs and mayonnaise lightly. Cover & chill in refrigerator 1 hour or so. Toss lightly with eggs and mayonnaise. (I usually chill overnight to really get flavors mixed).

**Hard Cook Eggs:** Put in saucepan and cover with cold water. Bring rapidly to boil and turn off heat. Remove from heat. Let stand covered 20 minutes. Plunge into cold water.

**Cook Potatoes:** Wash and cut in halves 4-5 medium potatoes. Put in saucepan with boiling water to cover and add 1 t. salt. Cover and boil 20-30 minutes. Drain and shake dry over low heat. Peel.

**Openers 101:** I was going to keep my contribution rather short this quarter with the first two articles, but the Editor complained.

I have done various things with my corner, including a questionnaire for spouses to tell about the collector in their life and studying the types of openers, etc. Articles on types really didn't add anything you can't get from the handbook or the newly published book, *Just for Openers* by Don Bull and John Stanley. It was interesting to me to read about a type and look at what John had in his collection and finding out where he got each piece, but I still didn't feel I was on the right path. When I asked John about articles on various types, he would remember an article and start paging through past issues to find the information I needed. I longed for an index.

Well, I had attempted to check the page numbers, but the notebook is locked with some special device and I couldn't see all the page numbers. The night before, immediately after John went to bed with all the children of the world, I went in and announced that I was having trouble finding the first issue. There appeared to be a lot of auction stuff or something at the very back of this monstrous notebook he has. He told me to keep looking. Thanks, John! Anyway, half asleep this a.m., I threatened him if he erased my summation of the Chattanooga article.

John told me to take out the references to the first issue and start that again next time, just include the Chattanooga article this time, since I had rambled on about it in great length. Ok, Ok!!! The article on the "Chattanooga Brewing Company" was actually a City Directory Advertisement in 1895.

Collectors make note, I think the odds are pretty good, if your spouse is going to Chattanooga with you to a show and you showed them the article in the 1st JFO newsletter, they'd read it. If I didn't have a deadline with this newsletter tonight (already almost midnight), I'd be looking around the house for some of the brands I've read about tonight. Chattanooga openers have some meaning now!!!!

Reading about Chattanooga makes me want to seek additional history in the libraries of the three major universities in our area. Maybe I will be bringing back information for John's newsletters. Maybe between my full time job at the University of North Carolina and my part-time business, I will wander down to the library that houses "Special Collections" and find out just what is hidden in that wealth of information.

The Chattanooga article unveils, not only the history of several breweries, it also weaves in some of the history of prohibition. When the founder of the Chattanooga Brewing Company died, his wife succeeded to president of the company and it continued to prosper. Listen again, male members of JFO, women like to hear such success stories. I wonder if there are any articles on Louise Reif? Would you like to go to the library with me, John?

In 1899, a sewing needle kit was an advertisement to introduce Imperial Pilsener beer. I bet Louise came up with that idea!

Much of the furnishings and memorabilia of the Chattanooga Brewing Company ended up in the Rathskellar. That would have been interesting to visit.

I'd like to see some of the three cornered bottles they filled with Grape Fizz and Tripure Cola when the Chattanooga Brewing Company became the Chattanooga Tripure Water Company and the Purity Extract & Tonic Company.

And what about the celebration the Women's Christian Temperance Union held when the brewery was razed to make way for a new Coca Cola plant in 1930? Tell me more about that history books.

And then the history from the Chattanooga Brewing Company to the Atlantic Company adds some more topics to be explored further.

I would like to watch John read this in the morning. Perhaps he will see that the woman who use to roller skate around the furnace in the basement in 8th grade, memorizing history notes, does have an interest in the history of his collection.

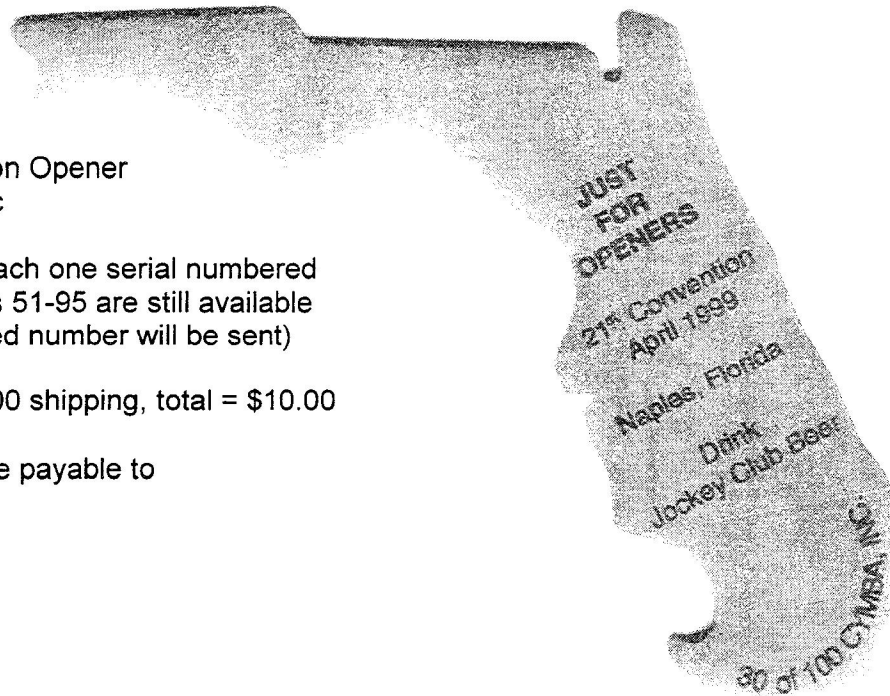

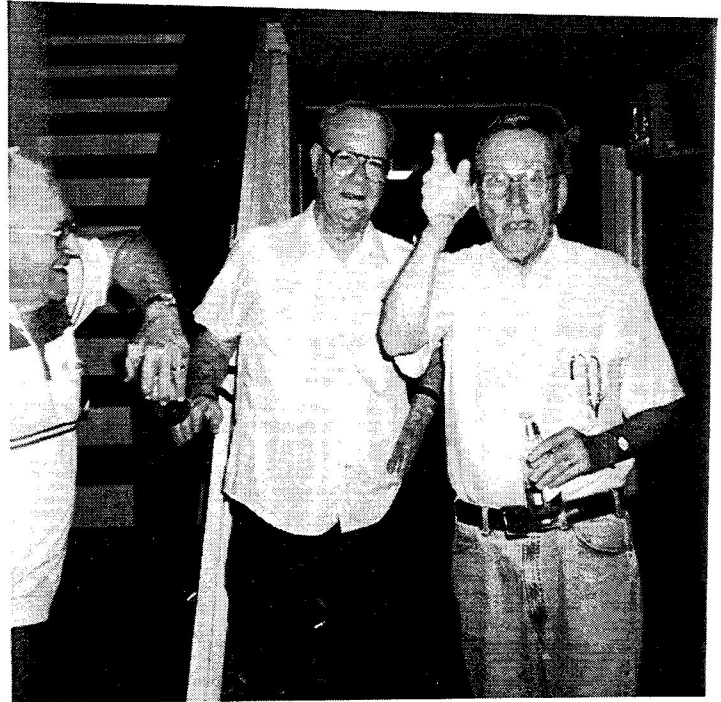


### Losing a Great Opener in the US Mail but it was Insured

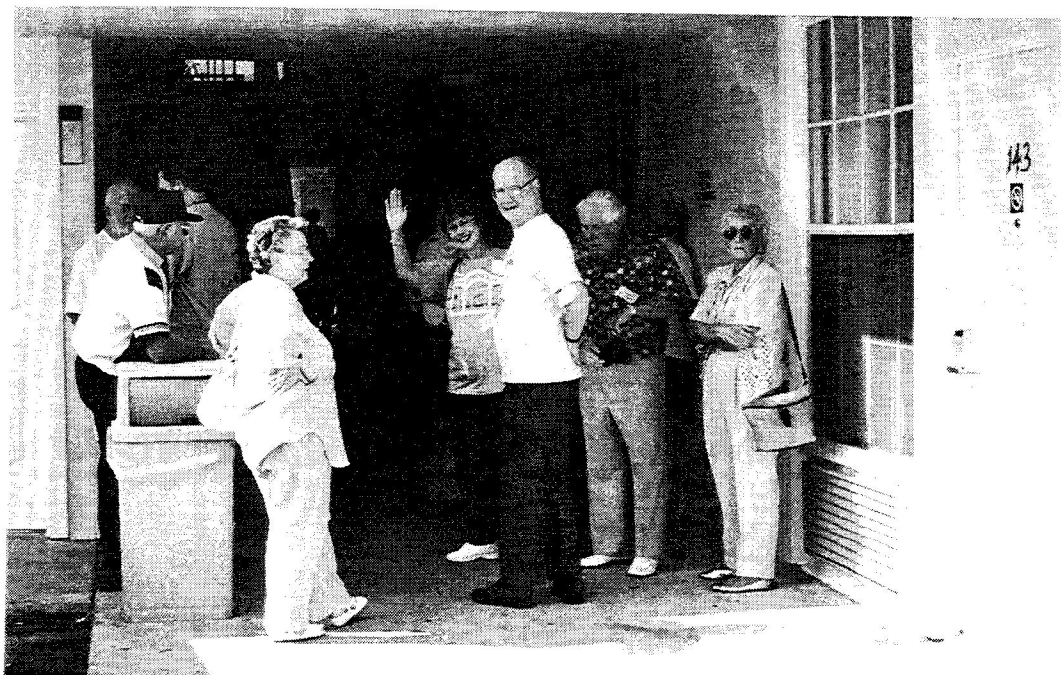
