It took me almost two hours to review the newsletters from 1986, a great year for the JFO publication. Membership was growing, there were 472 new additions and Bill McKienzie volunteered to do the "Opener Trivia". I caught myself wanting to read ahead to the next quarter to find out the answers. The official Just for Openers patch was finally a reality and available for a small price.

A book was reviewed that I hope John has, as I'd like to read it....yes, he is asleep, so I can't ask. The book is "Don Bull's Beer Trivia". The review said that knowing the answers can make you an authority on the subject. Well, that would be nice, since John is such a walking encyclopedia.

It was reported that the St. Louis Opener Club held it's November meeting in Art Santen's HEAVY METAL basement. The Christmas party was held in John Goff's BRASS basement. Gee, we don't even have a basement, just a CLAY crawl space!

A survey had been included in the October '85 issue. A B-2-1A Blatz was offered as a prize to the closest guess on the "total" amount of openers reported in ALL collections. The actual count was 130,479 with Harriet Waldo being the winner with her guess of 126,320.

The survey also collected information on the ages of JFO members. The youngest was 13 and the eldest was 83. The breakdown was: 10-20=3; 21-30=6; 31-40=26; 41-50=50; 51-60=32; 61-70=23; 71-80=4; and 81-90=1. Since none of our members have aged, the results would be the same in 2001, right?

Members had been collecting anywhere from 4 months to 40 years.

The printer that handled the printing of "The Handbook of Beer Advertising Openers and Corkscrews", had a section in a newsletter they mail out, titled "Some jobs are just screwy." The short article then stated, "But this is the screwiest one yet!". It went on to tell a little about the 500 copies they had printed and binded.

The April Opener Trivia asked for additional information about the bottle opener advertisement A.J. Cermak gave away with "For Beer and Wine" engraved on the front when he was seeking election to U.S. Senator.

The July issue included a lot of information about A.J. Cermak. Very interesting! He was mayor of Chicago from 1931-1933, the year in which he died, a victim in an assassination attempt on President-elect Franklin D. Roosevelt. He was a Bohemian immigrant who vehemently opposed prohibition.

Ed Kaye was living in Chicago at the time and has a very vivid memory of the event .

The July issue was absolutely packed with great articles and information. Ken Keown, son of Vic and Mary Ann had made plaque clocks for the 1986 convention, along with a Service Award made for Ed Kaye. We know the Keown kids are a great help as they and Mary Ann continue without Vic.

"It's an inventor's dream to find the ideal way of parting cork and bottle." .." When you consider how much a cork expands to fill a bottle neck and the number of pulled muscles that are suffered daily by people wrenching at particularly stubborn specimens, you will appreciate why so many hundreds of ingenious individuals have set themselves the task of inventing quicker, easier and more efficient devices than ever before."

No one seems to know for sure who first invented the corkscrew. Perhaps it was designed after the worm used in the 17th and 18th centuries for cleaning and extracting bullets from muzzle-loading guns.

Spouse's Corner by Pat Stanley (Continued)

Don Bull submitted an article on "Beer Advertising Corkscrews" and "Adolphus Busch Knife Corkscrews" for the October issue. Beer advertising corkscrews date further back in time than bottle cap lifters per the first article. The most commonly found beer advertising corkscrews are the wood T-handle type P-8 and similar. Pictures of a "peg and worm" corkscrew, roundlets, pump lever type corkscrews (waiters) and twisted wire corkscrews helped me identify some of the items in our home. The knife corkscrews pictured have stanhopes, picturing Adolphus. Yes. I have I seen some like that!

The quarterly Opener Trivia included drawings of knife openers that appeared in an article written by Dennis Ellingsen for the May 1986 issue of Knife World

Yes, indeed, the October 1986 issue is one to remember!!!

Once the New Year starts the JFO Convention comes quickly. Don and Cora Whelan were hosting the convention in St. Joe, MO. I did make Dick Creuziger happy by selling him a P-2-7 Pabst for \$150. You see the miscellaneous P-2s from time to time, but the others are tough to come by. Herb Danziger had a P-1 Strohs that I picked up, but nothing real special the rest of the day.

Don and Cora kept lots of snacks and food in the hospitality room with the main beers being from Boulevard Brewing Company of Kansas City. They had been kind enough to donate 15 cases of beer for the convention. That evening we went with Harold and Boots Queen and Joe and Jackie Young for supper at Apple Bees. Several restaurants and motels were in very close proximity to the Ramada.

Fortunately John (Jeb) Burruss brought his laptop computer and after some initial problems, he was able to sign on late that evening. I checked eBay, but the big item was closing Thursday morning, an A-47-1 Kruger.

I did find out that evening why Bob Stahly's initials are B.S. The story I had in opener trivia in the October 2000 issue about Ollie Hibbeler's unusual Coca Cola wall mount was just that, a bunch of B.S. I guess JFO is really about having fun and Bob had some with the bogus story to rub salt in my wounds. Bob showed me an O-509 Hood Coca-Cola wall mount and first said he had gotten it for \$10 on the way to the convention. He then fessed up that he had gotten it off eBay back in February. The week before it closed, he wanted me to tell him how to "snipe" bids on eBay, but he was going to Arizona and I told him I would show him when he got back. The Coca Cola wall mount would be closing while he was away and I figured, one less person to compete with!

The opener closed and I had entered a bid of \$113.99 at the last minute, but lost to an unknown competitor at \$114.59 (a mere 60 cents more). I was upset but figured that you have to lose sometimes. At the convention Bob tells me a friend bid for him and it was his friend's bid that got the opener. Bob said he laughed all the way home from Arizona. B.S. Bob Stahly strikes again!

Thursday morning Norm Jay and I decided to complete a trade started at Indianapolis. Norm got an L-2 Kolb Bros and I received a B-71-2 Old Colony, an A-19-3 Gutsch and a B-68-1 Cleveland and Sandusky. We had also started another trade. Norm had a B-2-12 United States I wanted. In return, he wanted me to trade some E-4s. In the end and only after Norm spent 10 minutes of silent meditation, we completed this deal. (only 10 minutes???). He received 16 E-4s and in addition to the B-2-12, I got some Pepsi ice tongs, a can opener and \$85.

We finished just in time for the group luncheon a Belt Brewing Co., but I decided to stay and help watch the hospitality room. At noon the real convention started with the arrival of John Mlady and Gary Deachman. Those two were rooming together. They like to have a good time and have a lot of good stories to tell (all true, Bob Stahly).

Jim Osborn got checked in and just like last year had a lot of great openers for trading and selling. I ended up trading him an A-54-1 A-B for a B-25 Cooks and an M-3 Henius Service Station.

Later in the afternoon Bill Pattie made it in all the way from Montana, thanks to his dear wife, Lyla and her sister Elda. He once again had his great collection of Montana openers, beer and non-beer. He also had his type collection up for trade, but until Saturday it was for Montana openers only. If by Saturday he had not made a trade, he would sell for the right price.

Even though he had one in his collection, I traded Bill an A-17-28 Bozeman for a B-7-11 Eulberg, a H-10-5 Burkhardt and a G-21-1 K.I.K. Malt. I ended up letting Jim Osborn have the B-7-11 Eulberg and Harriet Waldo the H-10-5, but she got my old one, after I upgraded.

Don Sherman's room was busy most of the afternoon and he seemed to be doing a brisk business. Everyone finding some openers and corkscrews and Jeb Burruss told me that I did get the A-47-1 Krug on eBay for \$187.50. Thursday evening was more room-to-room and a lot of socializing in the hospitality room. Some of the women did go gambling without much luck, except for Phyllis Gormally who took over Shirley Hibbeler's machine when Shirley ran out to the car for more money!

Friday morning we left for the Whelan's open house, viewing Don's collection and Cora's Campbell Soup items. We had Pat Stambaugh driving along with Joe Young and Jim Osborn as passengers. I was chief navigator and though Don had given us a decent map and it was only 12 miles, I got us lost coming and going. (This is why I don't let John drive at JFO...his mind is in Opener Heaven). Going out was not too bad, we just had to double back through town. Coming back we went out the old country road back to St. Joe.

Don has his collection displayed in trays that he can easily pull in and out of storage cabinets. He specializes in Schlitz (they are in a large showcase by themselves), Missouri openers and types. I believe most everyone attended and the house was open from 10-2. We left about noon to go back, but since we went the old country road, we missed out on all of the fun at the Jesse James Antique mall. Several corkscrews and openers were bought by JFO members with most coming from the booth of Ray Hanson, a JFO member who lives near Kansas City.

Back at the hotel it was auction time with lots of openers being submitted from 2:30-4. Vern Vollrath and I entered the item information and Pat Stanley and Corkie kept up with the bids, although Corkie slept through most of the auction, only waking up in time to bark at Art Santen with his funny "barrel" hat. Early on we knew it would be a good auction when a G-5-44 Tivoli opener saw spirited bidding. At \$30 Kurt Bachmann held his hand up and Verne told him he recognized his bid but Kurt kept his arm up. Kurt said, "I don't care what it costs I want this opener". Everyone laughed and everyone else passed so Kurt got the opener for \$30 (this same opener sold on eBay last fall for \$172.50, Kurt got a nice buy).

Besides common openers, quite a few good openers were submitted. Highlights are below with the top lot being an A-33-6 Fauerbach and yes your editor was outbid by Mike Krejci, a serious Wisconsin collector who had the winning bid of \$210.00. JFO's Dave Gausepohl makes Lexington KY Newspaper (sent in by Thom Thompson)

Beer Cans right stuff for collector Erlanger man has 400,000 brew-related treasures

Erlanger – Many parents in Dave Gausepohl's Edgewood neighborhood in the late 1970s worried their teen-agers would drink a few cans of beer, then go out and get in trouble.

But Gausepohl's parents worried about how many cans of beer their son was emptying on the ground, just to haul them home to his growing collection.

"No one can really understand it if they're not in it," Gausepohl said.

"We had a lot of battles growing up when they'd say, 'What are ya' gonna do with all these?" Look at Gausepohl's home today and you'll understand his parents' concern. It is wall-to-wall miscellany. At last count, Gausepohl had more than 400,000 beer-related treasures in his Erlanger residence.

His parents don't mind his sprawl of specimens so much now because not only are the collectibles out of their house, but many of the items are worth thousands of dollars.

Gausepohl presides over the 200-member Queen City Chapter of the Beer Can Collectors of America, where he is known simply as "Beer Dave."

The group just wrapped up its annual convention, held over St. Patrick's Day weekend in Fort Mitchell.

"Most collectors specialize, because of space concerns if nothing else," said Gausepohl, surveying his collectible-covered walls. "I've never even had a car in my garage in the 13 years I've been here.

"To me, this is like some kind of museum. But I don't see this as a nest egg. This is my child."

"Opener & eBay Trivia"

Every issue I think back and say eBay is slowing down, but that is not true. In fact this quarter I had the most listings to date and a lot of great openers are included. Please note I try to only enter prices for better openers and corkscrews.

The first prices that jump out are for Dr. Pepper openers, the A-17 and the two F-17s. This is the second A-17 I have seen sold on eBay with the first bringing \$450.00. The two F-17s sold about a month apart. The first one was the first occurrence on eBay for that style in Dr. Pepper. I guess one coming so close on the heels of the first one scared people off. I think a fair price for another one would be in the \$75-\$125 range.

Some Coca-Cola types appeared but not as many as in previous quarters. As usual the Starr X openers especially the Long Neck styles drew a lot of interest. The O-505 Lime Cola and O-505 Big Boy had been "professionally" repainted and still drew very high bids. I could not make any sense out of the high bids on the O-5s Frigidaires except some bidders had more money than had sense.

A wide variety of beer openers were offered with the nice beer knives leading the way especially the P-40-1 A. B. C. Despite the seller claiming "everyone knows what A. B. C. stands for – Anheuser Busch Company" when really it is the American Brewing Co. of St. Louis, it was a great knife and a good investment for the buyer. I just haven't graduated to the \$500 level and above for knives (that's okay – Pat). With the right brewery name common beer styles did well and eBay definitely brings in the local collectors. But even worse is when someone's family name is on the opener. As I watched the E-4-342 Eichler sell in amazement for \$132.50, a quick check of the results saw two bidders run the price up from \$5 with the high bidder having a last name of Eichler. This is the same opener that upon buying a box of 130 E-4 Eichlers in 1995, I ended up with 15 #342 and 115 #332. You never know and of course I sold most of the 15 for \$5-10 each.

My winning percentage this past quarter on eBay slipped dramatically from around 75 percent to about 50 percent. The competition just keeps getting tougher and tougher. The few bargains to be found are usually where the seller doesn't list the item correctly. One example is putting a nice M-3 Henius 1933 World's Fair slide-out opener in with a corkscrew knife and despite listing in two categories (Knives and Advertising) missed out on getting a good price.

Here are some of the more comical descriptions for "openers" this past quarter. An A-13 Car Figural was listed also as a "timing spanner". The listing was out of Australia and the seller thought it could be a bottle opener and someone suggested to them that it was a tool for adjusting the timing on a car. The seller agreed since it was consistent with the ad on the opener for car accessories. At least he deciphered the patent date of Nov 7, 1911 correctly.

Another seller claimed his common 1892 "Never Slip" can opener was patented "May 1792". Despite only asking \$8.50 he never got a bid. In fairness the condition of the blade where the patent date was stamped was in rough shape and did resemble a "7" instead of an "8". Obviously he did not know much beverage or food history as 1792 predates the invention on cans for storing food (but not by much).

Study the following auction results and please keep in mind that few bargains are there and a lot of overpriced openers were sold. We have all done it, you lose a few times and then the heck with it, I am going to bid through the roof. The main trouble on eBay with that logic is even if you win, you probably just beat out someone with little or no opener knowledge.
