## 34th JFO Convention Las Vegas, Nevada April 18-22

Monday: Thank God for Southwest Airlines and allowing two checked bags per person for free! When one flies it is so hard to bring a lot of stuff and I needed to bring a bunch of micro and plastic openers and the two bag policy would make it happen. After dropping Jazzy and Snazzy at the vet for boarding, a friend took us to the airport and dropped Pat and me off. My first issue was leaving my cosmetic bag with my pills in his car. Thankfully he was still circling the airport as I had asked him to stick around until I was through security with "the good openers". I had one heavy knapsack and security ended up scanning the bag twice. They took my three opener bags out and scanned just those bags the second time and asked what they were and where I was going with them. Once I explained it was an opener convention they were happy.

The flight was a long five hours and we landed in Las Vegas at 5PM. John Cartwright picked us up at the airport and took us to the Palms, a big hotel and casino just west of the main strip. Our first two nights would be in one sleeping room and then come Wednesday we would move to the room on the other side of the hospitality room. We got settled in and had supper and then I tried my first run at Blackjack and won a little bit at the $\$ 10$ table. After the long day we turned in about 10 after I played some more blackjack.

Tuesday: Since I was winning I went down at 5AM to play some more and had a so-so session, still ahead on blackjack. John brought the remainder of Don Sherman's collection to his room and I spent some time going through it. It was a lot of non-beer openers and items of all kinds. We both agreed that just about any offers would be accepted on this stuff (about eight attache cases and four other boxes full). We did some dealing as I bought a few from John and then he bought a few from me. We mostly dealt in micro openers as John is into finding those. With so many micro-breweries now producing a wide range of openers it can be a really fun area of collecting for opener collectors.

My luck at blackjack would continue Tuesday but then my last time playing that night I lost $\$ 150$. So far I had been playing at the $\$ 10$ table and ended the day up $\$ 175$. That evening John took Pat Stambaugh, Pat Stanley and I along with an old friend of his, Phil Arnold, from his hometown of Port Townsend, Wa. to a great buffet at the Wicked Spoon Restaurant at The Cosmopolitan. I must have eaten too much and that effected my luck at the blackjack tables (it is always those hot dealers taking your
money). On the return back to the Palms, we did go up and down the strip and tried to visit the "Pawn Stars" store but we arrived at 9:01 and they had just closed. From 9PM to 9AM they only deal through an outside window.

Wednesday: For some strange reason I kept waking up early so once again it was blackjack time. I started out fairly well and graduated to the $\$ 25$ table and would end the day up $\$ 300$. This gambling thing is easy. With most of the attendees arriving today that would take up most of my time. Despite several trips by John Cartwright to the airport there was one snag, I had lost Bill and Barb Arber's flight number so they had to take a cab. John got most everyone else.

The Canadians, Mike \& Theresa St. Amand and John \& Mary Lynn, were in early in the day and they brought one of the family members, Michelle St. Amand (Mike's daughter). As I told her right off, JFO is one big happy family and anytime some one wants to brings a friend or a family member please do so. Michelle liked to party and was the life of the JFO group for this show.

Whenever one is flying today, it is hard to bring very much, but I did have some good openers and a lot of micro and plastic openers. It did not take long for action to heat up as Jeb Burruss, Gary Deachman, Bill Arber, Pat Stambaugh and Scott Williams put a dent in what I had brought. I did so well on Wednesday that I had to make a bank run the next morning. A lot of good openers went out the door.

Only a few members did some gambling, most at the slots and I think Josef L'African and myself were the only ones playing much blackjack. The hospitality room was small but cozy. My first deal with Josef was on a P-2-4 Gerke for several miscellaneous pieces he had. In the end I had to kick $\$ 10$ his way. Then Josef and I were working on a trade for my P-185-1 Pabst and he would every now and then offer a $\$ 100$ casino poker chip in the deal. As I told him a couple of times before we completed the deal, you need to add more chips. In the end he did and with a couple of miscellaneous corkscrews the deal was completed.

Josef's fellow corkscrew collector arrived, Tommy Campnell, and Tommy took a little trip to the main strip that evening. He happened upon a man offering to let anyone kick him in "the nuts" for $\$ 20$. Tommy gladly paid and got it on video. Unfortunately it was not much in the way of beer advertising openers but it was a varied collection. Ed's convention had a dual purpose as he would be marrying his long time friend the next evening, Sue. A strange combination, openers and love, but it works. The wedding did occur and Ed even set up at the Saturday Show.

A few more members arrived during the day and early evening. After a really strong start in sales today was soso. I figured my best strategy was to stay away from the blackjack tables as at least I was even and could not go in the hole. That evening Gary and I joined Josef and Tommy at the Italian Restaurant in the Fantasy Tower (it contains the Playboy Club). They cooked a special gluten free veal and risotto dish just for me and it was outstanding. Unfortunately Gary got a ravioli dish that had four little raviolis on it. It looked like a small appetizer but no worries as Tommy shared some of his large portioned chicken parmigiana. For once I was up late in the hospitality room, but Tommy went dancing with Michelle and her friend, Noella. Tommy lasted until 4AM while the girls stayed up until 6AM. Word is

Tommy can dance and is the funniest man in the world. What a town, Las Vegas.

Friday: My one day with no blackjack or gambling of any kind. Once you are up a decent amount and then lose it back, it tends to leave a sour taste in your mouth. Today the JFO gang would be heading to Big Dog Brewing to tour, eat lunch and then some would go see the Pawn Stars store. Before folks left the second car load of openers owned by Clark Davis arrived. The first rumor was 200 pounds and then it was 300 pounds. Whatever it was it was a lot of openers. Clark had a hotel package deal so he was staying in the Fantasy Tower and it is definitely a nicer tower than the Palms Tower. The first group went over at 10:30AM and the bed was full of openers, the desk was full, openers on the floor and just openers everywhere. I did find a few items including a couple of CBOs, a couple of beer openers and some metal handle advertising screwdrivers. Clark was a novice at pricing so it was a little tough deciding on a value but he really wanted to lighten his load. A few of us helped.

The crowd took off for Big Dog and I stayed behind to await more arrivals. Pat had printed Map Quest driving directions for the five cars but the directions were not the easiest to follow and I think everyone took a different route to get there but they all made it. The tour, food and beer were all great so it was worth a little misdirection. Most people were back by 2PM and the hospitality room was in full swing as the auction would start at 4PM.

One of my chores was to set up chairs and we had decided to use our adjoining bed room as it was larger than the hospitality room. For the hotel today it was a huge pool party with loud music, lots of young people and lots of skimpily clad girls. In a lot of rooms the windows rattled all day from the noise. So we had this for a backdrop as the auction ran.

Once again Gary Deachman and Jeb Burruss acted as auctioneers and Pat Stanley was the recording secretary. Thank you to everyone who participated in the auction by either buying or selling. This year we only had a few passed items.

Friday night most everyone wanted to eat at the buffet downstairs but Pat and I opted for a return trip to the Wicked Spoon. John Cartwright drove us over and we timed it well as we walked straight in and did not have to wait. Another awesome meal but the cost there is $\$ 37.50$ versus $\$ 15$ back at the Palms. We took a cab back and had the hospitality room opened by 8 PM . Not many people hung around that night as the Saturday show was the next morning. Pat and I did go to bed at a decent time if you call 11:15 a decent time.

Saturday: One problem with the Palms breakfast buffet was it did not start until 8AM and that was the starting time for the show. Jeb had tried the Gold Dust buffet across the street the morning before, so I went over and it was pretty good but to me not as good as the Palms. Jeb joined me halfway through my meal but I left early to get over to the show. Using our large suitcase I made my way over. The show was on the second floor of the Fantasy Tower and the room was perfect for us. Twenty-five tables and plenty of space for everyone and displays. When I walked in at 7:40 most everyone's was there and checking things out.

This year we had seven regular displays and three "Bill McKienzie Best of Show" award displays. The regular displays included John Stanley's A-9 collection, John Cartwright's U. S. Beer P-Type Wooden Handles, Josef L'Africain's "Davis Corkscrew" collection, Mike Krejci's A-21 "Spinner Clock", Darvin Stilwell's L-1 Can Collection with variations, Dave Pinney's "History of Pinney Beverage Co.", and finally Art Santen's "Casino Openers". Mike Krejci easily won first place (for the third straight year) with John Cartwright winning second place and Dave Pinney third.

In the "Bill McKienzie Best of Show" award, John Stanley entered a M-3-UL Eichler's Beer, Mike Krejci a B-1-24 Rising Sun and Jeb Burruss a M-103-UL Pearl Beer. It was close between Jeb and Mike with Jeb winning the award. Congratulations to the winners and thank you to everyone who participated. Also thank you to the attendees for looking and voting. Mike has proven that if you put some effort and thought into it, you can win an award and usually first place.

As with most of our shows, things were dying out by 11AM but most hung around until 12-12:30. John Cart-
wright had twice been around the Las Vegas area and put out flyers for the show. In his second visit at several locations most of his original flyers were taken. In the end we had about 10 walk-ins. One of the last was John Laduck and he asked John Cartwright if he would do a package deal on any of his openers. John had 12-15 attache cases of Don Sherman's common openers and Laduck ended with about half of them for $\$ 200$. Laduck then came over to my table and bought four large bags of plastic openers for $\$ 50$. After hauling them for two years it was time for a new home. Laduck claimed they would end up in a museum. We will see. I do not know many museums that like plastic openers (he tried a pile of plastic on eBay for $\$ 50$ but received no bids).

I sold well at the show all things considered. The room was nice but finding it was not easy as hotel workers who knew about our convention were few and far between. We re-opened the hospitality room and most folks spent the afternoon hanging out there. At about 3:30 I tried my luck at blackjack one more time. Playing the $\$ 25$ table, I started with $\$ 200$ and ended up with $\$ 800$ as I finally found a really cold dealer. It took less than 30 minutes and I had Deachman watching. A darn nice good luck charm. When the dealer hit a couple of blackjacks I knew it was time to leave. Gary headed over to the slots and I headed back to the hospitality room to brag. A little later I checked on Gary and on the quarter slot machine he had hit a Royal Flush to win $\$ 1,012.00$. He was smiling ear to ear just like me. He had been in the hole pretty deep and this put him in the very positive territory.

At 5:30 we rounded up 30 folks who were staying Saturday night for a group supper at the Hofbrauhaus (German style food). The food and service was excellent as we sat at two large tables. The meal ended with us watching a large table of young couples volunteering the men to get paddled by a woman who worked at the restaurant (must be some old German ritual). She would take two soft warm-ups and then hit the guy hard on the butt. We watched five go through it and then headed back to the hotel.

For a final night, the crowd was a little quieter than usual. Tommy Campnell had flown out that evening and without his participation the jokes were not being told. I did try another stint at blackjack and donated $\$ 225$ back to the house in about 10 minutes. Easy come and easy go. By 10PM most people had said their good-byes and headed back to their rooms. We rounded up the leftover items for

Sunday: We were flying out at 9:15AM and Pat wanted to get going early. Of course she needed a cup of coffee and a biscuit so I headed down through the Casino to the other end where McDonald's was located. I had one $\$ 25$ chip in my pocket and figured I might as well donate it back to the Palms. ## "Opener and eBay Trivia" ("BIN" Buy-lt-Now \& "DNMR" Did Not Meet Reserve)

Another quarter with interesting results on eBay. One change is the summer season had started and some good openers were sold as the results below show, but most days seemed like surfing page after page of common, junk or new openers. With eBay's pushing new guidelines through, many sellers are cutting back or dropping out. One can only hope that this trend will slow down. Of course being 2012 the number of "old" openers coming into the market place keeps decreasing. Good corkscrews have really gone down in numbers on eBay as the ICCA Auction has taken that stage over. More random thoughts to follow in future issues.

## A-007-999, Excelsior Motorcycles Shelly Whitehead Allentown PA (Key Ring Hole is Gas Key), 8, $\$ 119.50$

A handful of examples of this opener have sold but never this high. The ladies' leg shape opener is unusual in that the key ring hole is also the gas key. Throw in the motorcycle ad and you have a large ending result.

## A-009-034, White Eagle, 8, \$89.88

A few of the A-9-34 White Eagle baseball players have sold over the years and they always bring a good price. This one being in excellent condition continued the trend. For beer advertising baseball player openers there are about five that appear quiet often and the rest only rarely and some very rarely are seen.

## A-012-014, Rahr, 2, \$76.00

This sale was one that surprised me. I know the A-12-14 Rahr sword is hard to find but this price was very high and condition was very bad. Someone just had to have this opener.

## A-017-036, Schooner Brew, 6, \$126.19

The Schooner Brew is a hard to find Chattanooga, Tn. lion head figural opener. Just another example of why many Tennessee openers sell for a high price. Schooner Brew was most likely a prohibition drink.

A-033-005, Hamms, 8, \$152.51
A-033-005, Hamms, 6, $\$ 79.88$
A one time very desirable Hamms opener and a harder style to find with beer advertising. The A-33 "big fish spinner" brings a lot of attention when a beer ad one is sold but the A-33-5 Hamms has seen several examples the last couple of years. Sometimes a good thing appears too much and thus the low price on the second example.

## A-999-999, Harley Davidson Motorcycle Spinner, 6, \$511.99

The Harley-Davidson motorcycle spinner figural is one of my all time favorites and by now many examples have been sold. The final price of this one was about where one would sell for in today's market, $\$ 500.00$. About half what I estimated one would bring in 2007. Again too many appearances of a good piece can drive the value down even with boat loads of Harley-Davidson collectors.

It was a great quarter for beer brass openers and I was the lucky seller of the B-2-35 Bangor at $\$ 355.00$. When you read the October JFO issue you will see that some other folks followed suit and tried to sell their own Bangor opener. The B-1-21 F\&S was probably the nicest example of that opener I have seen. The B-1-24 Rising Sun is always a popular opener because of the great logo on the opener.

## B-013-008, Heileman w/ Fob (BIN), 6, \$74.95

B-013-999, The Biltmore Westchester NY, 6, \$118.50
Over the years I have seen many B-13 Heileman beer nifty corkscrew openers with a Heileman fob attached. Why these openers this past quarter went very high is a mystery to me. I would figure a $\$ 10-\$ 20$ opener with the fob. I listed the B-13 Biltmore Westchester NY result because I would have paid maybe $\$ 3$ and it brings $\$ 118.50$. Could have been a hotel collector but most likely someone who like Westchester, N.Y. items.

B-018-698, Lemp, 4, \$157.50
B-021-318, Wilber, 6, \$158.50
B-021-318, Wilber, 6, \$122.50
B-027-004, Franks, 4, \$140.00
"B"s can certainly bring high prices especially brass or rarer types but not many bring over $\$ 100.00$. I am not sure why the big money for the B-21-318 Wilber as it normally brings $\$ 20-\$ 50$. It has to be some local collector wanting one badly. I thought I had the only known B-18698 Lemp and tried to sell mine after this one brought $\$ 157.50$. I was asking $\$ 100.00$ and received no bids. The brass B-27-4 Frank had no paint but still did well as maybe the fourth or fifth example known.

## B-037-002, Birkenhauer \& Berger, 8, \$195.27

One of the "sets" I am really proud of is having all three known B-37 beer advertising openers. As far as I know these are the only three known ads of any kind on this style. This example went high but only the second B-37-2 I have seen. A hard type to find.

Boy I sure hated to see this one offered for sale. Another opener I thought I had the only known example. Oh well at least mine is in excellent condition. This one looked pretty bad but still generated some interest before selling for $\$ 236.49$. Jim Osborn was the lucky buyer and now owns both beer B-71s (the other being a B-71-2 Old Colony).

C-011-006, Falstaff, 8, \$50.00
C-011-006, Falstaff, $8, \$ 80.09$
C-011-UL, Steinerbru Beer, 8, \$76.60
Again I am not sure why a C-11-6 Falstaff would go through the roof in price. Even being in great condition I would think $\$ 20$ would be on the high end and these two above brought a lot more. The C-11-UL Steinerbru was a previously unknown Atlanta, Ga. beer opener and went to a "very serious" Atlanta collector.

## D-001-035, Michel, 4, \$168.38

D-003-020, Miller, 6, \$133.33
Until a few years back I always figured cast iron U. S. beer openers were rarely worth more than $\$ 50$ except for the harder styles to find. It is not unusual anymore for a good D-1 or D-3 to bring over $\$ 100.00$. The styles are some of the earliest U. S. beer openers and are generating a lot of interest including several bidders from overseas.

E-003-056, Abner-Drury, 4, \$49.99
E-004-999, Coca-Cola Oklahoma City Bottling Co (w/ 3
Misc), $6, \$ 136.49$
E-004-999, Drink Cheerwine, 4, \$138.50
The wire results consist of one E-3-56 Abner-Drury going for $\$ 131.59$ and then I listed one and got my opening bid of $\$ 49.99$. Sometimes a second example works out but it usually scares off bidders if it appears quickly after the first auction. I was runner-up on the E-4 Coca-Cola opener form Oklahoma City. The plan was to sneak in there and buy it. The plan blew up in my face. The last result on the E-4 Cheerwine is a really strange one. One could see $\$ 50$ for the opener as it is a popular one when offered but $\$ 138.50$ is way up there.

## FBOC-217, Pocket Watch, 8, \$172.50

As I have commented many times the last few years, cast iron figural bottle openers are suffering as the reproductions have scared off a lot of collectors. The pocket watch result is shown as that one rarely appears for sale and brought a decent price.

## G-005-UL, Mohawk Valley Brewing Co Schenectady NY (w/ 9 Misc), 6, \$111.38

Another opener that I truly believed I would sneak in and buy cheaply. Wrong again as a fellow JFO member spotted it also with nine common openers. I did win out and was very happy to add this one to my G-5 collection. Not many beer openers from Mohawk Valley.

## H-001-044, Norton Gold Band, 4, \$67.76

The H-1 Norton opener comes in three different listings and appears from time to time in each of the three. Not a rare opener but anytime a Norton opener appears on eBay it gathers several bidders. I am assuming a family member wanted it as $\$ 67.76$ is a lot of money for this $\mathrm{H}-1$.

## K-ND-ND, Pabst Blue Ribbon (Porcelain Single Lever Bar Mount), 8, \$243.91

This "New Discovery" bar mount will appear in the October issue but your editor was the winner on this one. I have to do some searching but one of the old JFO issues has an ad showing this opener. It is a heavy porcelain opener and Pabst is stenciled in the base and embossed on the handle. It was found at a Kansas Flea Market. It is amazing what great openers continue to turn up that were previously unknown.

## L-002-025, Anheuser-Busch K C, 6, \$271.99

Jim Osborn beat me out on the L-2-25 Anheuser-Busch from Kansas City. Until this one appeared I had the only one I knew of. Nice buy Jim as the L-2-16 BudweiserSchlitz from Kansas City has seen several examples sold. Both of the L-2s were from the Mahan Supply Co. in Kansas City. So this made two openers Jim got this quarter (counting the B-7-1-1 Chattanooga) that I thought my collection had the only known opener. Oh well, that is what makes collecting interesting is finding those rare pieces.

L-004-064, Manru Schreiber Brewing, 8, \$560.00
Jeb Burruss was all over this opener and placed a bid of $\$ 275.00$. He was about half way there and finished in fifth place. Whether you like L-4 wooden bottle openers or not, this price result was very impressive. The Manru is known as one of the hard to find and very desirable L4 s . The great condition of this one I am sure ran the bidding up (see Opener Trivia pictures).

## L-999-999, (Similar L-1 But Bottle Shaped) Sebewaing Beer (Fantasy), 8, \$127.75

Obviously our friend, airborne306, has a good supply of Sebewaing labels to stick on the "L" type drop down bottle openers. He takes a $\$ 5$ drop down bottle, adds a "rare U. S. beer sticker" and presto, he makes some real easy

money. Please be careful. It is one thing to pay $\$ 10-\$ 20$ for one of these fakes but to pay $\$ 127.00$ is crazy.

After several attempts by this seller, someone bought this M-2-18 Muehlebach lithographed opener. The seller had dropped the price and the opener was in better than average condition. "M-1"s and "M-2"s are hard to find in nice condition for even the common ones in today's market. The Muehlebach is definitely one of the harder openers to find in the "M-2" style.

## M-003-037, Sheridan (Blue) (w/ M-3-14 Piels \& M-3-29 Victor), 6, \$236.49 <br> M-003-999, Coca-Cola (No Paint), 4, \$103.78

The seller had the M-3-37 Sheridan listed under trays and once again I was ready to sneak in and get a good opener. It was bridesmaid time again as a Wyoming collector ran me over. Any Sheridan slider is hard to come by. The M3 Coca-Cola slider was only the fourth one I have seen or heard about but with all of the red paint missing, the final price was about right. If it was nice shaped it would bring \$300-\$500.

M-073-010, Kessler, 6, \$250.50
M-073-014, Budweiser Beckers, 4, \$184.49
Slider corkscrews saw same nice prices realized with Missoula and Kessler pieces bringing strong results. I was actually offered the M-73-14 Budweiser/Becker corkscrew and was going to buy it for $\$ 100.00$. When the pictures arrived I backed out and the owner did much better listing it on eBay. "Good" may have been a generous condition grade but someone paid strong for an off-grade piece.

Two different listings for the Coca-Cola boot shaped knife and a big spread with the resulting prices realized. Once again when a second example appears soon after the first, most bidders shy away. Even the lower price shows that Coca-Cola openers, corkscrew and knives are doing well.

The only reason you hide a bidder's identity is the seller is either shill bidding (running up the bid) or the seller has multiples and does not want anyone else offering wall mounts to the non-winning bidders. Regardless they are selling some great looking wall mounts.

Our JFO Starr historian, John Eblen, was the lucky winner of this one at a good price of $\$ 217.50$. It has brought much more in the past.

The P-17-1 Yuengling was in great shape and the final price was high because of the condition. The P-170-1 Pabst was in rough shape and I was very surprised at the "very high" final price of $\$ 305.00$ as the knife was really a filler piece at best. When both blades are broken it is one rough knife.

The R-6 result just shows how far FBOC prices have fallen. At one time a solid $\$ 500$ opener, then a $\$ 300-\$ 400$ opener and now down to less than $\$ 200$. Be careful.
