The Opener Convention was held at the Holiday Inn in Hazelwood, Missouri on the weekend of April 18, 1980. Ollie Hibbeler was the convention sponsor. Bob Chapman was responsible for motel reservations and transportation. Art Santen was the greeter and in charge of publicity. All three did a most commendable job and carried the event off without a snag.

On Friday, the 18th, Ollie, Bob, and Art hosted a get acquainted hospitality room where all the beer, pretzels, and chips one could want were available. The trading and drinking festivities broke up about 2:30 AM with everyone worming their way back to their rooms burdened with loads of openers and beer.

On Saturday morning the red eyed and foggy opener collectors found their way to the restaurant for breakfast and on to the meeting rooms for more trading. By noon 16 Just for Openers members had arrived and rummaged through each other's openers. 12 guests came timidly into the room at varying times, and whenever a newcomer was spotted with a cigar box under his arm, those on hand were like vultures swarming to the prey - looking for that elusive opener! There was indeed an awful lot of time spent leaning over tables looking at the thousands of openers - a lot of sore backs the next day for sure!

Displays included: Bob Chapman's type collection, Art Santen's state souvenir collection, Clayton Griggs type E openers, Phil Fouch's Michigan openers, Ollie Hibbeler's St. Louis openers, and Mr. Corkscrew (Joe Balaban) and his specialties.

A brief business meeting was held and was followed by an auction of donated openers to offset expenses. Highlights of the auction were an R-3 Iroquois Indian at \$31.00 and a pair of cast iron false teeth wall mount at \$32.00. It was agreed that Bob Chapman would sponsor the convention next year. Business?! Although Ed Kaye had made a survey before the convention and had circulated results to attendees, nothing was brought up at the meeting. Ed mailed his questionnaire to 129 Just for Openers subscribers and 79 NABA members. 57 of the 208 responded in favor of having a club, 22 responded in the negative. As over 50% did not respond, it could be concluded that the majority are happy with things the way they are. I am in complete agreement with Art Santen's summation: "Continue to use Don Bull's newsletters. Use his list as membership. No dues, no meetings, no officers. One convention a year, host club arranges for convention to pay for itself."

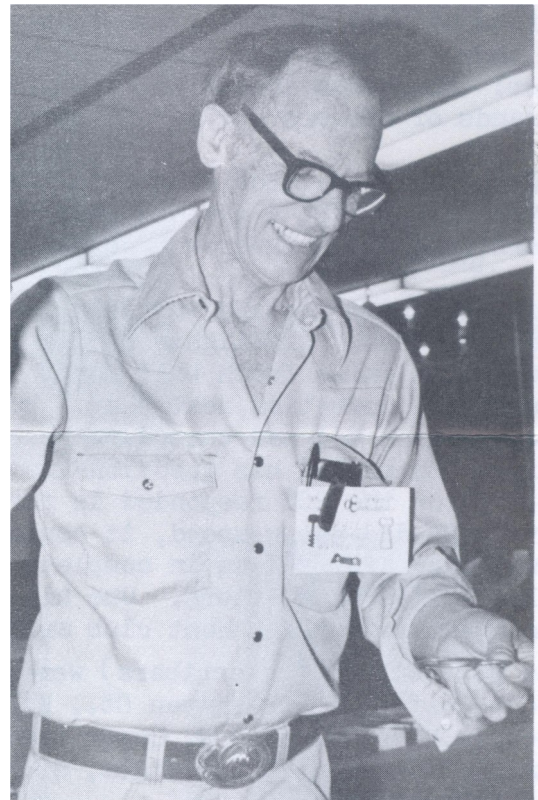

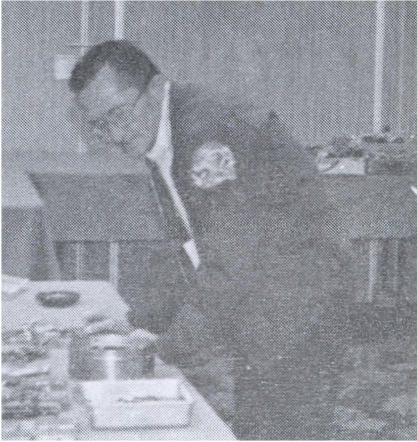
Ollie points out a drunk on a street sign opener and a man with corkscrew. Did you pose for those openers, Ollie?

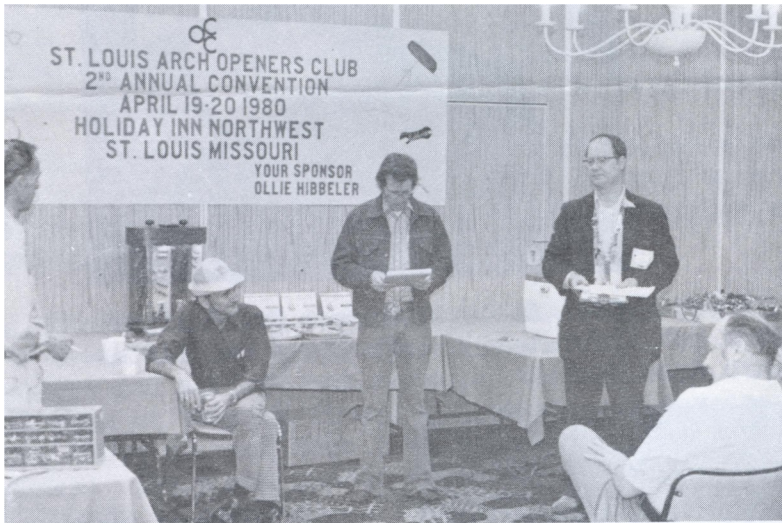

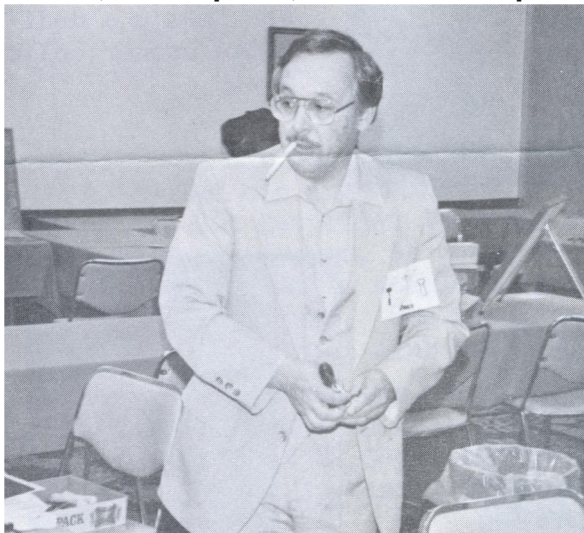

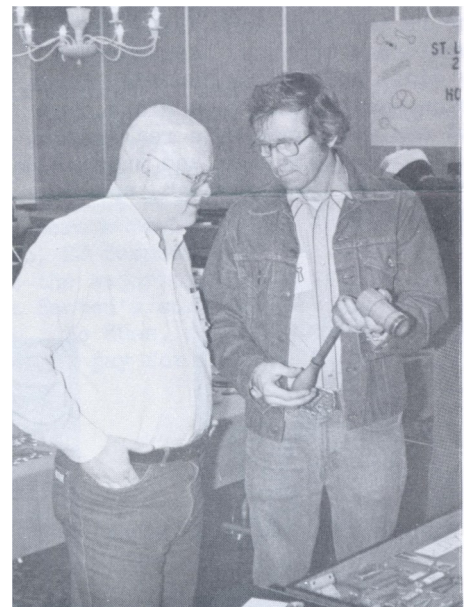
